October nearing its end sees another page in our calendar nearly complete for the year.

Our **Mattara Hillclimb** was successful again; there are a lot of willing workers behind the scene that wholehearted thanks go to. There is a special little group that were put on the spot and come through with shining colours, and most of the people didn't see or even know about.

The story goes this: Starting Monday morning King Edward Park had a rather large dosing of rain (I guess something over 100mm). Of the long-time competitors I spoke to, no one could remember receiving rain like this on a hillclimb day.

I had organised the \$1.5m cherry picker from Boom-Sherrin (the newest, biggest and greatest in their fleet) to attend our Hillclimb for the two days, and was booked out on a job 6.00am Tuesday morning.

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Andy - so pleased to see the cherry picker off the grass!

With all the rain the Driver "Glen". Col. Brae or myself could not see the cherry picker navigating around the side of soldiers' point hill without burying itself into the ground as it was so soft from the rain. Glen had used mud mates before on Energy Australia jobs, and they worked a treat. We needed these mud mats desperately. With assistance from Col Bray we contacted Martin Reeves for approval to get and use these life saving mats. Steven Hill, the next piece in the jigsaw, he was unwell and didn't run in the Hillclimb was able to give us access to the depot to collect the mats. Brian Ford's company A.S.A.P. sends a 2t truck around to collect the mats. The mats put around the side of the hill during the last rain storm of the day allowing the truck a path around the hill on the softened ground. We loaded the life saving mats back onto the A.S.A.P truck and nobody knew we had ever been there. The sight of the cherry picker back on the bitumen road was a huge relief to me. Thanks to the small but valuable group who saw the cherry picker off the grass. All the helpers behind the scenes are MG Car Club Newcastle members. Thanks.


Continuing on with the MG TF LE500 story, in England it is known as "The Comeback Kid".

NAC MG finalised the development of the new TF LE500 engine known as the N series. The N series has a stiffer lower engine rail and uses a multi-layer steel shim cylinder head gasket, which can't suffer from the original design's common type of failure. Mechanical Specifications: LE500 comes in only one mechanical specification with a 135bhp EU4 compliant 1800cc engine mated to a five-speed PG1 gearbox. The same applies for the suspension and brakes, with the former being a development of the 2005 model year's softer and significantly more comfortable standard suspension, and the latter being the highly regarded 304mm diameter big

brake spec. with the visibly striking AP Racing four pot (piston) callipers up front. Wheels are also a carry over of the 16" 11 spoke alloys with the same 195/45x16 front and 215/40x16 Goodyear Eagle F1 tyres.

The new models with revised standard suspension are much more comfortable, with little detriment to the cars excellent handling. The test driver confirms the ride of the new LE500 is just as good as the 2005 models he had driven.

High Levels of Safety and Security: One of the most important carry over features is a very good Euro NCAP four star adult occupant and three star pedestrian safety ratings, but still very competitive. Interestingly the four star rating was achieved when the passenger airbag rating was still an option whereas today it is now standard. Let me put this in some perspective. Many cars now receive 5 Star adult occupant safety awards but in the



whole of 2007 NO car received four stars for pedestrian safety, and over 2/3 of cars tested only achieved 2 Stars, so the TF remains a true leader in this area.

The previous Thatcham category 2 level security has been improved to Thatcham category 1 through various areas having better shielding; although one change to catch out those familiar with previous TF or MGF models will be the way the alarm and boot are connected.

The sound system is a Pioneer (1 DIN sized) radio/CD head unit supplied with a remote control and a flying lead for the IPOD laid in the glove box. There are also electric windows and front and rear fog lamps.

A small but significant improvement is the satisfying 'thunk' when the door closes, rather than the previous 'clang' of the earlier models. Another improved area was the floor carpet fit to stop the pull away near the sills and front lower corner of the door aperture. Boot carpet has extra fixing to improve the fitment in the boot, with better quality carpet used throughout. One

area that really illustrates the drive for better quality that NAC MG has made throughout the car is under the bonnet. Most MGF and earlier TF owners will recall the cheap nasty, flimsy black plastic behind the spare wheel that covered part of the bulkhead area below the windscreen panel. In the LE500 it's a thicker much better self-supporting plastic moulding with a proper shape and very smart. Incidentally the spare is now a full size alloy.

Reporter goes on to say driving the LE500 is probably the most important aspect and the good news here is that he felt that it is the best TF he has driven so far. Another feature is the 'double wipe', which is simply a programmed addition to take care of the extra dribble that occurs after a wash cycle has been completed. Fuel economy for the test car averaged just over 35mpg over all roads and conditions.

Wonder when we will see the first LE500 in Australia.

The presentations at the Tennis Club on each day were very welcome after such traumatic days and the sausage sizzle and cold ale were certainly popular.


NSW (narrowly?) won the Carline State of Origin Shield with both "real" Queenslanders saying they would come back next year.

OZZIE MOTOR RACING ICONS

PART TWO IN A SERIES

BOB JANE



Guess who's Mustang put the tyre marks on Beechey's 3 wheeling Monaro?

Growing up in the inner Melbourne suburb of Brunswick, this man's passion for cars took him to the top of sedan racing in Australia.

He started a business known as "Bob Jane Autoland", concerned with the distribution of parts for Alfa Romeo and Jaguar. Becoming more intimately involved with the auto industry meant it was inevitable that Jane would venture onto the race track. He entered competitive racing in 1956, and by 1960 had developed his skills to such an extent that he was rated as one of Australia's top sedan drivers.

His big break came in 1961 when he and codriver Harry Firth won the Armstrong 500 held at Phillip Island, driving a Mercedes-Benz 220SE. Jane and Firth won the race again the following year, and continued their success when the race moved to Mount Panorama in 1963. For 1964 he drove with George Reynolds and racked up yet another victory. Some drivers have surpassed the number of victories achieved by Jane in this testing enduro race, but no-one else has been able to string together four successive back-to-back wins

In the 40 years in which the Australian Touring Car Championship has been awarded, only 16 men have won it, and of those 16, only 10 have managed the feat more than once. During the sixties the Jaguar MkII was one of the most

competitive cars in the hands of top UK touring car drivers like Stirling Moss and Mike Hawthorn. When Bob Jane campaigned one in Australia he won Touring Car titles in 1962 and 1963. Then almost ten years later Bob repeated this dual feat to be crowned champion again in 1971 and 1972. Overall he finished on the podium 21 times from 38 starts in that competition.

He was a fiercely aggressive competitor, one who didn't shy away from swapping paint or leaning on the door handles of anyone alongside him in the era before such

behaviour was frowned upon. He was wholehearted. One day at Warwick Farm in the 1960's I watched in the pits as he climbed in and out of a series of cars, competing in just about every race on the program. I can still remember how exhausted and hot he looked by lunchtime. Little wonder!

Bob campaigned many Fords including Cortinas, Falcons and several Mustangs, Holden Torana XU1s and A9X, an Elfin big banger Can-am style sports car, and a one of a kind all aluminium bodied "Le Mans" E-type Jaguar coupe which I believe he still owns.

When not competing on the track, Jane was able to concentrate on his business interests. The importation of parts, especially tyres, earned him a reputation in the industry for being as tough as he was on the track. In 1965 Bob Jane opened the first "T-Marts" store in Melbourne, which still remains an independent, family-owned business.

Bob Jane retired from racing in 1986, although his many contributions to motor sport would continue. Being a passionate follower of NASCAR. Jane constructed the \$54 million "Thunderdome" at Calder Park Raceway which opened in 1988. Its success was assured when the likes of Bobby Allison, Neil Bonnett and others from the Winston West Series all attended From 1980 to 1984 he attracted some of the best Formula 1 drivers to the Australian Grand Prix held at Calder Park Raceway (The "Thunderdome"), this event being a precursor to the Australian Formula 1 World Championship Grand Prix held in Adelaide in 1985. From 2002 to 2004 Bob Jane T-Marts held the naming rights sponsorship for the Bathurst 1000, the race Jane had dominated early in his career.

Today his public and bitter divorce feud have shown Bob on our TV screens as a broken man who has battled and known great rise and fall. But let's not forget this man's

personal driving achievements, the huge number of local drivers he put into his team race cars, and what his sponsorships and leadership have done for motorsport enthusiasts in this country.

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


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
