RALLY REPORT

Despite the decline of forest rallies and dwindling numbers of entrants at Touring Assemblies

these days, I happily took on this position for 2009 when I realised the role also included responsibility for our club's Rallysprints.

Although it's been decades since MGCCN ran one, the Ringwood tracks we've progressively reclaimed for khanacrosses over the last six years were in fact originally built for Rallysprints and off-road races. This restoration work has now reached the point where we basically only need to join up the tracks currently in use to get a 3.5km special stage before they're all probably swallowed up in a few years if the new simplified club tar circuit proposal goes ahead.

The committee agreed to my suggestion, and we now have a NAMS Rallysprint round scheduled for 22nd August this year. My idea is to find our feet running just one this year, and then maybe run two in 2010 if all goes well. If you're at all interested in dirt racing these events are within your grasp and well worth considering.

Rallysprints have regularly been my top competition high for many years both locally and at state level, and what I consider I ultimately build my club car to withstand and succeed in. What are their entry requirements

above a khanacross?

Although navigators aren't compulsory and not really necessary at most Rallysprints, all crew members need to hold a National Rally licence. You upgrade to this level by sitting through a CAMS informative on-line lecture & subsequent test, and by being checked driving in a couple of khanacrosses and/or a motorkhana by event officials. Recent racing already done in them can also be considered for these observations

As our event will also be a State round all cars will need a full roll cage, 2kg fire extinguisher (can be 2 x 1kg), carry a pair of emergency triangles, and have to be log booked. Kevin Edwards is the man to talk to about the latter. Full harness 4 point seat belts and normal speed event neck-to-wrist-to-ankle clothing are the minimum.

WAC are running a Rallysprint each month at Awaba from April to July, and we'll hold the 5th NAMS round, so it might be worth the effort to get yourself into this exciting local series. You've certainly got time. We'll need lots of officials and five 4WD's as recovery vehicles, so consider helping out if you don't run.

Three AHRG Touring Assemblies and another two of our own means it's certainly going to be an eventful year. Get involved!

MARULAN TRAINING CENTRE

Many of you would know the name Gary Wilmington from his successful V8 Supercar career and his stewardship of Wakefield Park Raceway for about eight years. Gary has been involved in driver education for many years and following the sale of Wakefield Park, Gary decided to upgrade his long established driver education facility. What has resulted is an 8m wide and 1 km long circuit. To get to the track you turn left off the main Sydney- Canberra road at Marulan and then journey into the scrub for about 7km, then up a great driveway to the circuit.



I was privileged to be one of the first drivers to try the new circuit, with a group of MX5 drivers, on 5th & 6th January this year.

Both days were very, very hot. The facility is not totally completed, there was a lot of work being done to line and paint the Admin block and to landscape the circuit – but there were garages with shade awnings, toilets, office etc. It is a very functional facility. The fee for each day was a neat \$100 and I could have done as many laps each day as I wanted.

The day began with Gary walking us around the tight and twisty track as he explained how each corner was designed to teach a different aspect of driving, and how to best attack it. If only I could have remembered all of the tips he gave – or even some! The surface, being brand new, was very smooth and with no rubber on it was not as "grippy" as I expected. The state of my tyres indicates that I did my bit to remedy this. In my 1990 NA6 It was a tight 2nd gear circuit – I only just hit third towards the end of the short main straight and then it was almost immediately back to 2nd for a very tight right hander. I was near the rev limiter almost all of the way – it was tight, technical and yet because it was designed as a training centre track, it was forgiving. I didn't need to use the run off areas, nor were any of the drivers challenged by the banks that surrounded much of the track.

Gary was a great host. I spoke with him on the verandah of the administration block while I attempted to take some photos of the cars as they entered onto the main straight. In designing the track and getting it through council, Gary had many hurdles to overcome. Remembering that this was an existing dirt facility, the problems that he faced in getting approval to upgrade it almost caused him to quit a number of times. He has noise problems with neighbours (they are a considerable distance away)

and the banks that surround the track are designed to direct noise upwards – the ability to give spectators a good view and to provide run off areas are just bonuses. The road into the property is much better than the 2nd class rural access road you have to travel to get there. Despite this Gary has to put in turn lanes on the "main" road outside – they are the best feature on this road. Then there's the dam and the water catchment he had to put in, and the tanks to catch water etc. It did sound a little familiar. Congratulations to Gary and Natalie for their achievement. They see the circuit as an adjunct to and not a competitor to Wakefield Park.



As the mercury pushed past 37 degrees, and with lots of laps, my tyres went off and suddenly lost grip. With all that hard 2nd gear work, my car experienced some overheating problems. It actually boiled after I left the track. The needle has never before moved from the normal position. In preparing the car I had topped up the power steering fluid and that also boiled over. Luckily there were plenty of specialist MX5 mechanics available and I did no permanent damage and I was informed these were common problems in my model car under those conditions.

Later in the day I got to do some hot laps as a passenger and driver of a dedicated NC racecar. What a difference! 130kw at the rear wheels versus maybe 60 kw in my car. Same driver and different car went 6 secs faster – remember it's a 1 km circuit. A six speed box meant that sitting near the redline in 2nd was out and lots of gear changes were necessary. The significantly bigger ABS brakes had the 6 point harness straining and the 2 It engine had so much more power you were pushed into the back of the seat! Then there was the stiffer chassis. The world has certainly progressed in the last 18 years. Still it was a harsh ride and in some ways not as "fun" as my snail, everything came up so fast and all forces were greatly amplified. But, it was an experience. For only \$30K I too can regularly go as faster.

I forgot to mention that the a/c gave up somewhere during the "testing" process – about lap 90 or so I suspect. The trip home was not as pleasant as it might have been. Too hot to put the roof down so it was back window down and side windows down. Then strap in some chairs and my large bag behind the roll bar. Not unbearable but Audrey did remind me at least once that she was uncomfortable (or words to that effect).

What a great experience.

Do you wish to become a competent driver?

This course is designed for junior drivers from the age of 12 to 18 years old. The course will consist of tutorial on car control, safety and car preparation.

Driving instruction is on a one-on-one basis, with instructors approved by the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport (CAMS). It is preferred that participants have some driving experience in sprint karts, motorkhanas, khanacross or RTA learners permit.

Pupils under 18 years of age will require a parent or guardian to sign the entry form to give permission.

 A scrutineering (safety check) will be carried out on all training vehicles 30 min before the advertised start. Please make sure your vehicle is in a road worthy and safe condition.

- Your car can be a road registered or unregistered vehicle, single seat competition vehicles are not allowed.
- Safety apparel required is neck to ankle cotton-based clothing with long sleeves.
 A helmet and flat thin sole shoes are preferred.
- Drivers of open top sports cars must wear gloves and goggles or a helmet with visor.
- Cars should also be equipped with a fire extinguisher, bonnet strap and seat belts in good condition.
- Entry for junior members of the MG Car Club Newcastle is Free.
- Entry for junior members of other car clubs is \$11 dollars. Why not join the MG Car Club Newcastle and gain the free entry.
- Minimum license requirement is a CAMS L1 (come and try) license at \$25 dollars.
- 12 month license will be available on the day.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

MEDIA RELEASE - Monday 20th August 2007 Finding the right cover for you

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
Geelong 10th - 14th April 2009

as the Christmas break was celebrated by the panel having two weeks off. Unfortunately, a severe storm just before Christmas dumped 60mm overnight on Ringwood, with the road in and Pit areas badly damaged.

Hopefully this will have been attended to by the first event at the end of January. The damage to the Pit area has been inspected and a plan to stop the washaways has been formed for presentation to the Committee.

The first working bee will be on Saturday 21St of February when work will commence on terracing the Pit area to slow down water run off.

Over the break work has been progressing on maintenance of our equipment with a rebuilt gear box courtesy of Newcastle Gearbox and Diff, a rebuilt clutch plate and finally the problem that started it all, new

universals in the tailshaft.

The tractor has required a new water pump fitted and also the condition of the fan belt led to it being replaced. We are still waiting word on the development of a circuit, but there is plenty to do in the meantime with upgrading of the drainage along the main access road leading to the hillclimb.

Slashing will need to be carried out to discourage regrowth in some of the cleared areas, also these areas need to be cleared of rocks, so if you can attend some of the working bees your help would be greatly appreciated
