


For ladies there will be a special hillclimb at Ringwood. Borrow a competition car and just come along for the fun and experience.





# **BOARD OF DIRECTORS - POSITIONS**

PRESIDENT The leader, chairs committee meetings, and has the casting vote in case of a deadlock decision. Delegates jobs to committee persons, encourages members at events, and always acts with the best interests of the Club and its members.

VICE PRESIDENT Assists the President, stands in for him/her when the President is absent. Helps other committee members with any special projects.

HONORARY SECRETARY Takes the minutes, deals with the incoming and outgoing correspondence, circulates information to members, via the magazine, and passes on information to the various panels. Answers enquiries about the club and its activities. Is in touch with CAMS a lot.

HONORARY TREASURER Handles the Club's accounts, receives the money, deals with banking and investments. Is responsible for paying the accounts, keeping records and making sure that the books are audited at the end of the financial year.

PUBLICITY OFFICER Inform members and the general public of our activities. Always striving to keep a high profile of the Club whenever possible. Extra promotion for large events such as State Hillclimb events at Ringwood, King Edward Park, etc. Endeavour to get Club information into newspapers, radios or magazines. May assist the Register Captain with displays and parades, and the Editor with advertisers for the magazine.


CLUB CAPTAIN Organises the Club Championship structure and maintains the Club member pointscore, assists with the calendar. Receives results and working bee records and attendance sheets for the pointscore. Co-ordinates with panels to organise trophies for distribution after the events.

SOCIAL SECRETARY Provides supper for Clubnights each month, does not have to cook, can be purchased. Organise other social outings as well as Christmas/Presentation Dinner and Natter Nights. Can form a social committee of helpers if necessary. Help with catering at events if required.

MAGAZINE EDITOR Does not write the magazine, but receives articles written by others to edit and produce the magazine. Ensures the magazine is delivered to and from the printer. Organises the Magazine Assemblies and posting. Handles gathering of advertisers, artwork and invoices.

MG REGISTER CAPTAIN An MG owner, someone who is likely to attend most of the Club runs. Organises the monthly Register Runs, also the annual Concours. Keeps the register pointscore for MG owners, contacts MG members for promotional parades or displays.

MG REGISTER SECRETARY Assists the Register Captain to plan and conduct MG events. Ensures enquires and correspondence specifically relating to MGs are considered and answered. May act as National Meeting Co-ordinator organ-



ising accommodation and travel arrangements. Looks after the Club's Historic Registration Scheme. Keeps abreast of MG information in Australia and overseas.

EVENT CO-ORDINATOR Is an important part of setting up the year's calendar along with the Club Captain to construct the Club Championship pointscore. Helps other panel members to promote their events. Is responsible for keeping the calendar current with event changes that often happen, and supply to Editor a list of coming events for the current magazine. Ideally a NAMS delegate as well.

CHAIRMAN of RALLY PANEL Organise Rallies/ Rallysprints/ Touring Road Events for the year. Can use other Directors, organise checkers, officials, liaise with local authorities, Police, Forestry etc., paperwork to CAMS. Bring rally matters to committee for attention.

CHAIRMAN of SPEED EVENT PANEL Organises Tar Speed events such as Ringwood Hillclimbs, Supersprints etc. This persons does not have to direct all these events, but is responsible for making them happen and can assist. Make sure event permits from CAMS are in place and supp regs are distributed to invited clubs. Make sure enough officials are organised and the venue is ready. Results to go to the Club Captain. Might keep mailing list of competitors.

CHAIRMAN of AUTOTEST PANEL Organises the Motorkhana/ Khanacross events for the year. Locate suitable venues. Once again does not have to organise all events, but responsible to organise officials, timekeepers, paperwork to CAMS etc. Send results to Club Captain.


CHAIRMAN of EQUIPMENT MAINTENANCE PANEL Responsible for the maintenance of mechanical equipment at Ringwood Complex. Does not have to fix it personally, organises necessary work to be done by others, so that equipment is fully functionally. Makes recommendations to Committee re equipment needed.

MEMBERSHIP SECRETATY Processes new members and keeps a database of club members up to date. Ensures new members receive relevant information on joining.

CHAIRMAN LAND PANEL Is responsible for the maintenance of the Track and surrounding area at Ringwood. Organises anywork to be done by other parties or organises and advertises working bees of club members for general maintenance of the Complex. Works closely with the Speed Event and Equipment Maintenance Co-ordinators.

MEMBER No.1 This person has no direct responsibilities, helps other committee members with projects, and may have previously been on Committee.

MEMBER No.2 Must be first appointment to the Committee, assists other committee members. Is a good introduction to the running of the Club and its business and activities.

# **PUBLICITY Peter Robinson**

What a lot of news to catch up on this month.

Your Publicity Officer missed this column for September and October Clubtorque. The promotion, publicity and advertising job for the Mattara Hill-climb's three weeks (yes, that's right - lead up week, event week, after week), plus the six weeks beforehand meant that something had to give. This period coincided with a very busy time in our shop, along with losing a valued staff member, interviewing and finding a new replacement.

The preparation of the publicity and advertising for the KEP weekend was as good or better than ever this year, but again shocking weather negated a lot of the work.

To get a good return on investment for the Club, you need at least 10 days warm spring weather leading up to the event to get the public into a summer frame of mind after winter. Then you need a warm to hot dry weekend for people to be in the mood to see, hear or read about the event and think "I'll go a sit on the grass and watch the Hillclimb in that beautiful park overlooking the sea".

Instead, a lead up week with weather that got progressively worse culminating on Sunday with 45mm downpour in the morning driven by winds gusting up to 75kph, topped off by an electrical storm with lightning strikes in the park, and then more torrential rain resulting in streams 50mm deep flooding the track. After all the work put into promoting the event, I felt quite depressed.

As it happened, the sun came out and Monday wasn't too bad, with a drying sun and warm weather without any wind, resulting in a few hundred spectators - unfortunately not the few thousand we should have had with better weather.

I take the job of Publicity Officer and the spending of the Club's funds on advertising very seriously and conscientiously, so when, after a fine event people say "should have spent more" and then after a wet event, say "he spent (wasted) too much", I worry about it.

A lot of people possibly don't realise that nearly all pre-event publicity has to be bought - that means any articles which the publicity officer or other Club members write and provide for the Newcastle newspapers have to be supported by advertising paid for by the Club's sponsors, some of whom double up for this, after having already paid for advertisements in the Programme.

The Maitland Mercury and Port Stephens Examiner will do pre-event articles but only on local competitors within their towns, again from text supplied to them. The old idea of reporters and photographer going out and doing stories only happens after the event - that is when it becomes news - the same with TV and radio. Having said all that, we are very grateful to get any news stories after the event.

It is a similar story with all the radio stations in the Hunter Valley (there is actually round about eleven) and we provide information before the event and some of them are happy to help publicise before and after.

Of course the Press doesn't just "turn up". That involves many e-mails, phone calls, reminder calls, follow up e-mails, more calls, because -

"Oh, it is this weekend? Bill has gone on holidays and didn't tell me about it ..." -

but we smile happily through the phone and say,

"Oh that's OK, we can send more tickets", reminding them again of when and where, what day, time, who to contact, writing down their mobile number because the press all have anonymous numbers that you can't ring them back on (of course, e-mails have been lost, tickets lost, phone messages lost and they say that they never received anything).

Also, being a competitor helps and certainly increases your own adrenaline rush on the day - for example, taking phone calls just as your run is called, like -

- "Do you have the results yet?" Well no, we have another two hours to run.
- "Who is leading?"
- "Who is coming second and third?"
- "The guy in the Torana what's his name, where is he from, how old is he, is the car supercharged, what was his last time?"

# Aarrgh!

"Hurry up Robbo, get in your car now or you will miss your run".

Sorry, I'll call you back in half an hour.

Back to reality!

The Sunday and Monday events were brilliantly run and organised under the most trying conditions, which kept the Clerks of Course, Dave Atkins and Dennis Tynan on their toes.

I believe all Club members should be especially thankful (not only to Officials like these) but also that we have members such as -

John Collins, for overseeing the organising of the event and working tirelessly over all the meetings leading up to the long weekend (and after) to ensure the event actually would run.

Similarly, the effort put in by Gregor Dickinson, who is listed as "Secretary of the Event" in the programme. What an understatement of his role! Or more realistically, his performance of that role. At every meeting, every phone call, email, the answer would be "OK I'll do it, leave it to me".

Also, Judith Rae. Apart from Doug, I would possibly know nearly as much of her



incredible effort to produce the high quality programme that we had this year. It was an amazing job, particularly as the formatting and layout was largely done by Judith at home, after chasing sponsors for artwork, correcting details, getting photos etc.

30<sup>th</sup> Sep/1<sup>st</sup> Oct King Edward Park



# **AUTOTEST PANEL NEWS**

Just one more motorkhana to go to complete this panel's work for the year, this being the event on 27/11/11. Hopefully there will be sufficient interest to make the event a success.

I don't consider the year to have been all that successful for Autotest events from our club's point of view. I have made comment on the main contributing factors throughout the year. Fundamentally the lack of quality grounds and tracks, make it difficult to promote events successfully, particularly when some members of other clubs consistently bag our complex, with or without good reason.

This year we conducted 3 motorkhanas (+1 to go) and 3 khanacross events (2 being state series rounds). Thankfully the first state event pretty much subsidised the rest of the year financially.

From the table below the grounds at WAC Awaba, which are acknowledged as being about the best anywhere in the state, attract good fields to their events. I don't believe they run the events any better than we do, just have better grounds and tracks.

The events on our championship, in summary, were supported as shown in the table on the next page.

While our numbers may be small, I believe when the NAMS and State results are final, a number of our members will feature prominently. It is a shame that there isn't greater participation from our members.

There are a few trophies yet to be presented from our events this year, given that I can't be at the event on 27<sup>th</sup> November due to a stewarding commitment that weekend, I will do the presentation of those trophies at our Club Presentation evening.


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
