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



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

As you are probable aware the log awaited DA has arrived. Barrier Number One has been successfully negotiated, now the real work begins. Quotes and reports are presently being sought for the tasks ahead.

Before construction in any form can begin council require Arborist and Ecologist reports. As well as detailed plans of the proposed extension etc. Some pricing is becoming available and these will be tabled as soon as possible for approval before any expenditure can occur. In essence all quotes must be available before an informed decision can be made.

As you can see in the photo, sump construction is nearing completion, another couple of courses of blocks and we might lose Rick. Who says we don't learn new skills on shed day? Rick can now add block laying to his CV.

The next step is to await advice from the drainage engineer on our fill levels for the paddock area. It is not expected to commence this work until after the State Round in August.

Remember that the Thursday Working Bee/Shed Day is open for all club members. If you think you might like to attend to find outwhat goes on, please call either myself or Doug Rae and we will make sure there is a chair for you at the lunch table.







# What Lies Beneath by Doug Rae

At Ringwood, that is! Other than tons of gravel and rocks, from day one there has been a constant battle with water run off.

The original track had 5 pipe crossings and 5 sumps to collect the water. These culminated in a series of open drains, some 6 foot/1.8 metres deep, cutting through and flooding a large percentage of useable land.

From day one of MGCC Newcastle acquiring the property, piping and filling these open drains has been ongoing, firstly with the large one running through the Pit Area, which has been piped and 2 sumps installed.

Lately a very comprehensive project has been undertaken further down from the Pit Area with pipes acquired by Dave Atkins. This required 200 metres of trenching being dug and 400 metres of pipes laid, requiring 4 sumps which are presently under construction. These will control surface water.

With this in place we have reclaimed approximately 1000sq metres of useable land and given us some control over the water run off.

This major construction all up, with the pipes, labour, and concrete adds up to between \$30,000 to \$40,000. However, with our own machinery and volunteer labour it has cost the club \$1,500 in fuel and materials.

Obviously, these types of savings will be ongoing thanks to the Thursday group known affectionately as Dad's Army. Too many to name, but if you have contributed in some way I would like to on behalf of the members offer my thanks to all these people.


