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2012 Alpine Classic 13th & 14th October

Get your classic out of the shed and join fellow motoring enthusiasts on the two day 2012 Alpine Classic Rally. Running for the 14th year, the Alpine is the only timed navigational event in NSW and is considered one of the premier events on the Classic Rally Club's calendar. Set in the beautiful Central West of New South Wales, crews will have the opportunity to drive on some of the best roads this state has to offer.

Three categories of navigation will cater for all levels of skill. Those with experience and seeking a serious challenge will opt for Masters, whilst crews requiring a little more guidance will go for the Apprentices. For anyone just wanting a fabulous drive in the spring countryside without the challenge of navigation, the Tour category is ideal, although a small amount of mapping will be included.

The Alpine will start in Lithgow, at the foot of the Blue Mountains. The event will travel a circuitous route to the overnight stop in Orange, where competitors will have the opportunity to spend a relaxed evening and catered dinner with their new found rally friends. After a good night's rest, it's on the road again for another day of Classic Navigation Rallying. After a provided lunch it will then be on to the traditional pub finish near Lithgow.

The event is open to pre-1982 cars of any marque. Other cars will be considered on submission to the Event Secretary.

Included in the cost of \$429 for a crew of two will be breakfast at the start in Lithgow, two lunches, a sumptuous evening meal in Orange, motel accommodation and break fast. Your rally pack will contain all maps needed for the event, windscreen banner and car number, rally roamer (for new entrants), Alpine Classic caps and cloth badges. Alpine Classic shirts will also be available for purchase at a cost of \$30.

Cost for additional crew members or passengers is \$160 each.

The event will be strictly limited to 85 entrants, so get your name in early! Entries close on Friday 14 September 2012.

RINGWOOD PARK

This month's update shouldn't take too long. The wheels are not moving real quickly, much as we would like to see some action.

Firstly the board has given the approval for a subcommittee to be set up to manage the project. This will be made up of the executive, namely myself, Greg Hunter, Darval Thomas and Ken Mcleod, plus three board members Doug Rae, Alan Bates and Rick Vincent. Most of the committee have been involved since the very start of considering the upgrade of Ringwood a few years back. The idea of having this group is to expedite the decisions that will need to be taken, vet quotes and contracts etc., so that recommendations can go to the board for action much faster than having to wait for the monthly board meetings to roll around. The final decisions on any major work will of course always be made by the full board.

The purchase of the new shed to house all the clubs equipment and machinery has now been passed by the board at a cost of thirty thousand dollars. This is made up of the shed \$16k - \$19k for the shed depending on the finish chosen, \$7500 for the concrete and \$2500 for erection. It was decided to go with the finished article rather than try and get help from within the club as judging by the replies from last month most people have a lot on.

We have started on the job of getting the construction cert. from council. We now have a quote (\$3500) from an ecologist for the work needed, an arborist has been onsite today (26/7/12), so we await his quote, and the water and drainage plans are in the process of being drawn up. I would like to thank IRH for giving us access to his contour plans for us to work with. Also a private certifier has also been asked for a quote, so we have the option of using a private supplier or using the council. We will compare the two.

That's about it for this month. Hopefully by next month we should be really starting to make some headway towards the serious stuff, building it!

Is it me, or do the months get shorter? Work is somewhat arduous at Ringwood at the moment. It's a never ending battle with rain and the ensuing mud.

Rick has managed to finish one of the sumps and has taken on the task of construction of the rest. It won't be long before it is all finished and it's a good job well done.

As you would have read in the last magazine, we have acquired some drainage pipes for use when the extension is underway. These are now safely at Ringwood. Also there was a list of available opportunities for club members to be part of the construction of the track extension and facility upgrades. Don't forget to let Bryn know of your area of interest/expertise.

You can strike off the shed move from Mount Thorley. This was arranged by Jennean Bates and Don Anderson. The sheds were delivered to Ringwood on the 11th July and positioned on Thursday 19th July. The comments from some of the club members present on the 22nd would suggest we have done well in the acquisition. We must thank Don Anderson for making the sheds available to us and in brokering the deal with the owners. Many thanks. Without the dedication of Dad's Army and the ability and equipment provided by them, the positioning of the new sheds would not have been possible.

On the 14th July a scrutineering course was run at the Cobby St Clubrooms with ten attendees. The next phase of the journey to become a scrutineer is to gain experience on the job and then an assessment. It was pleasing to see a few of the œurse participants at Ringwood on the 22nd helping out in the scrutineering bay.

Pricing for a new equipment shed is available and has been presented to the Board for approval. We are still waiting for advice from the drainage engineer on our fill levels for the paddock area. This work will not commence until after the State Round in August. Also, further meetings with council are on the agenda to finalise some of the points in the DA Approval.

Remember that the Thursday working bee/shed day is open for all club members. If you think you might like to attend to find outwhat goes on, please call either myself or Doug Rae and we will make sure there is a chair for you at the lunch table. Or in the new building next to the secretary's hut.

The 2013 MG National Meeting will be based in Toowoomba (Qld) and hosted by the MGCC Qld. The Easter period falls outside of the NSW School holidays starting the following week 12th - 28th April.

There will be the traditional events of Concours, Motorkhana, Touring Assembly and social gatherings. The Speed Eventwill be held at Morgan Park which has undergone extensions since we were last there for the 2004 Nat Meet.

So it is time to think about accommodation for next year. I have had several conversations recently with the accommodation officer Bev Clydesdale and we have settled on the Jeffrey's Rainforest Motel as being suitable for our Club's needs. Phone No. (07) 4635 5999 - Fax (07) 4635 9823. www.jeffreysmotel.com.au This motel has undercover parking and each unit is 1 Queen + 1 single or 1 Queen + 2 singles. It is an older type motel but seems very clean. Tariff is \$94-00 double with \$10-00 each extra person. Mind you our experience has often been that some motels put their prices up at Easter but this is what we are currently being quoted.

Last month I sent out an exploratory email to those regular Nat Meet and register event attendees, and have only received a few responses back. It would also be useful to hear from those who normally attend Nat Meets to confirm if you are not attending so that I don't keep pestering you for details, if nothing else. At this stage I have 10 rooms booked with the possibility of a couple more on reserve. 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

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FRONTLINE DEVELOPMENTS

The iconic MGB turns 50 this year. No doubt worldwide there will be celebrations. In

the UK the birth country of the MGB a firm called Frontline Developments has done something very special to celebrate the MGB milestone—it's built a 2012 version of the MGB GT. It carries the very symbolic name LE50. Limited Edition with only 50 to be built.

I recently spoke to Ed Bracklic the project manager for the LE50. He is very excited



about this 21st century MGB GT. The original MGB 1.8 litre motor produced 65 kw and saw the car's top speed at about 155kph. The LE50's Mazda 2 litre engine produces 158kw with a top speed of 260kph. The LE50 comes with Connolly hide seats, Wilton carpets, electric windows, electronic starter and a state-of-the-art sound system. The makers claim 0-100kph in 5 seconds. That is supercar time. In save the planet mode the car returns a very respectable 6.7 litres per 100ks fuel consumption.

This brand new car is being built on the original MGB jigs. Body wise it is identical except for a few minor aerodynamic changes beneath the car to cater for a 260kph top speed. Smiths Instrument were commissioned to build 50 sets of retro instruments for the LE50s.

Even with Australia's favourable ex change rate the car will set you back \$93000 plus importing costs. But you can be almost assured this car will appreciate in value. There are already a governly bound for Australia. Here a lock at the website ways for





2012 JUNE GEAR REPORT - GROUP D

(It's all true - I just jazzed it up a bit!)

Cold, cold, cold but nice and clear with no rain - Goulburn weather was just as Lisa ordered for the Seventy - somethingth GEAR event. And what an event!

Warwick Farm Remembered

Grid lineup was decided by practice times with all competitors assembling on the Dummy Grid. The staggered start failed to separate the field who soon joined together to become a howling, slipstreaming pack.

With speeds of over 300km/hr reached at the end of the main straight, the competition for positions was fierce, with continual overtaking at the kink before the first right turn (a complex similar to the Le Mans 24 hours circuit - the flat-out Mulsanne kink preceding the Mulsanne corner). Keith Walters in the Morris Minor showed great courage, maintaining pace whilst battling a high-speed aerodynamic problem in the fast section of the track, the rear end clearly lifting at top speed.

By lap six, the field had separated: A three-way group for the lead developed: Alex Huzsti in the Sebring Sprite, Carl Stephenson in the Morris Major (the car very similar to that driven by Martin Brundle at Goodwood Revival in 2007*) and Guy Thompson in the Anglia. Midfield action was frantic, with the three Healeys of Dowsett, Komor and Coles in a five-way battle with the Triumph TR3As of Richards and Revill. The event finished with the three frontmen crossing the line almost simultaneously: It appeared Stevenson was about to win but Huzsti in the Sprite jumped from the slipstream at the last instant to flash across the line and win by a nose, followed by the TR3As of Richards and Revill in front of the snarling Healy pack**.

Results were: 1 Alex Huzsti, 2 Carl Stephenson, 3 Guy Thompson.

Catalina Capers

Three leaders emerged in this event Leigh Bowman in the MGB in close company with the nom-de-plume entry of "Spiffington" (rumoured to be an English Lord of the Realm) in the Sunbeam Alpine***. Both were soon caught and passed by Colin Goldsmith in the Austin A90. Goldsmith's handling of the fishhook was awesome to watch, with a clean entry to the first apex followed by a sprintcar-style powerslide through the exit, the car balanced between tyre grip and induced slide angle generated by the raw power of the tuned engine.

Unfortunately for the Carl Stephenson Morris Major, mechanical troubles forced a retirement. The sharp, shark-like teeth of the crown wheel attacked the smaller,



defenceless sunwheels deep inside the differential. Despite Carl's heroic efforts to save the poor sunwheels from their awful ending, their fate was sealed. His diff packed up and was unable to continue. RIP the sunwheels.

Seriously, perhaps the most exciting car of the Group was the 1936 Ford Coupe, conducted with skill by Rob Blake. This is a really beautiful construction of a 'like it was' vehicle- wonderful paint job, immaculately clean and so reminiscent of the early Pan-American racers on which greats like Fangio, Marimon and the "Pampas Bull" Frolian Gonzales cut their teeth. Before WW II, these future stars learnt the craft of motor sport in long distance events across South America, bouncing across dirt roads, dodging cattle and avoiding political revolutions and mobs of bandits. The beautiful engine bay with tuned flat head Ford engine must have been producing the best sound of a race car this side of the Snape Zephyr Special. What a wonderful machine!

Regularity honours can only go to one driver, however and it must be Brian "Red Mist" Richards. As regular as a kilogram of Laxettes, Brian had the rare distinction of nominating his time (a quick one for a roadgoing TR3A) of 1.21.50 and achieving it precisely! Think about this. Blink your eye - that takes about a 20th of a second or 5 hundredths of a second. So Brian lapped to his planned time within a fifth of a blink. Now blink again and it hits you how close he was!



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
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
