

Most Newcastle participants received a trophy, which contributed to our club coming 3rd in the John Wratten and 2nd in the Nuffield Oceania. Of the major prizes, Alexander Reeves won the Jean Kimber Cook Trophy for Junior Drivers with Fran Hodgson taking home both the Joan Richmond Trophy and the Cecil Kimber Centennial Trophy. Not to be outdone, Darren Hodgson won both Outright Motorkhana and Outright Sprint Trophies.

Many of us had a test drive of the new MG6 hatch which was on display at the Concours. Brant Raymond from the Queensland club took the Chinese delegation accompanying the car around the Motorkhana course, and it was worth the trip just to see their faces at the end. They asked what he called what he did with the car, and Brant (a man of few words) said "I don't know what you call it - in Australia we say 'dump the clutch"...priceless.

The report of the April Run will not make this magazine as the deadline is a week before the event. We are going to the Macadamia Farm at Medowie.

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LAND PANEL Doug Rae

The extensions are well under way, with all drainage pipes in place and with headwalls and sumps being built. The final layout has been determined taking into account some rock shelfs that were exposed during the initial digging out of the track. Approximately 300mm of gravel has been laid and compacted, with the gravel being sourced from our quarry which has been a great saving in overall costs.

Work is proceeding with the filling and levelling of the pit area with spoil from the track dig out being used.

Preparation for hillclimbs is progressing as normal with mowing, cleaning of toilets and such type of work being attempted along with work on the extensions. Which brings me to a subject which needs addressing. Once the tar is down a great deal of work will be required to put in place guard rail tyre barriers, tyre buffers, ripple strips, fences and generally tidy up the place in preparation for track inspections by both the police and CAMS to achieve our licence to compete on our new track. With this in mind we will be organising some Saturdayworking bees. So keep a eye on our website because we will need help.





NATIONAL MEETING TOOWOOMBA 2013

While we had attended National Meetings in Adelaide in 2010 (social), and Newcastle 2011 (various admin and organising jobs), the 2013 meeting in Toowoomba was my first as a competitor.

We decided on a relaxed trip so left on Wednesday morning, travelling via Gloucester and Thunderbolt's Way. Not a good decision! We managed to catch two fully loaded gravel trucks with trailers just outside of Gloucester taking material to the landslip site 30+ km from town. Just completed surface patching south of Walcha meant more car preparation in Toowoomba.


We stayed overnight in Glen Innes, and were first to arrive in Toowoomba. Accommodation was arranged by the organising committee; our motel was most suitable - helpful management and staff, covered parking and plenty of extra parking for tow cars, trailers and extravehicles. Most of the Newcastle group arrived during Thursday afternoon, with dinner at the pub across the road.

Most were able to register and be scrutineered on Friday morning. This was held at Picnic Point, location for all social events and the Concours. The rest of the day was spent on car preparation. In the evening it was back to Picnic Point for Noggin and Natter, including Rocker Cover Racing. The scene was set for a good weekend with Andy scoring a win.

Saturday morning was overcast. By the time we reached the park for the Concours we were in the clouds, with conditions damp enough to require regular drying of cars. Once our class judging was completed we had plenty of time to check out a great display. There were many fine pre-war cars, as well as good examples of all post-war models. Fran's ZR and our ZS made final judging but were beaten by an F(TF) for best modern.

The about-to-be-released MG6 was also on display, and some people managed a test-run. Distributers, MG Motor Australia, were main sponsors of the meeting.

Saturday evening was theme night, appropriately for Toowoomba, a "Garden Party". Many groups ignored the obvious of long frocks, parasols, blazers and boaters. The Newcastle group went as the garden - ladies were flowers and men were trees! The Victorian group attracted attention as garden gnomes and fairies.



The motorkhana was held at a transport / storage site on the western edge of the city. A large entry meant that the field was divided into groups. There were some showers during the morning, but conditions deteriorated for the final group after lunch (sedans and some Bs). Many of us therefore competed in torrential rain and poor visibility, although the surface proved to provide surprisingly good traction. The Newcastle contingent claimed many class wins and places with Darren taking FTD. The weather improved sufficiently for an evening BBQ at the motel.


An early start for most people on Monday, with Morgan Park at Warwick being the location for the Sprint. Again Newcastle was very successful with many class wins and places, and Darren taking a rare double with FTD.

Meanwhile, the Shorts were taking part in the Observation Run. This was a very challenging event, with three different types of instructions and many questions and photographs. The route took us through the eastern suburbs and rural areas on the escarpment, then through lovely farmland on the Darling Downs. The finish, for a late lunch, was at an historic house near Allora. We were pleased with a second place in the MGB group as half a dozen cars were within three points.

It was becoming apparent that Newcastle would have a good Presentation Night. There were many multiple trophy winners, including the Hodgson, Fraser and Reeves families. Special congratulations to Fran (three Class Wins, Best Lady and Best Overall), Darren (FTD in Motorkhana and Sprint + Concours place) and Alexander Reeves (Best Junior). Newcastle came 2nd in the Nuffield Trophy and 3rd in the John Wratten Memorial Trophy, a great achievement against the bigger metropolitan clubs.

After breakfast on Tuesday morning we headed to Brisbane to catch up with relatives, then south through Beaudesert. We crossed the border on the Lions Road, a great drive, now fully sealed but with some very dodgy bridges on the NSW side. After overnight at Kyogle we followed Summerland Way through Casino and Grafton to Coffs Harbour - little traffic, no roadworks, quite a contrast to the Pacific Highway. Caught up with friends at Old Bar, then called in to check progress at Ringwood on Thursday morning.



A GRAND HISTORY

THE FIRST AUSTRALIAN GRAND PRIX

During the early 1980s, motor historian David Manson found reference to the first Grand Prix in a Sydney newspaper. The article stated that the Grand Prix was held in Goulburn on January 15, 1927. He thought it was a misprint as he knew the first mototbike Grand Prix had been held in Goulburn.

Whilst Wayne Adams had been researching for his book "The Racing Boys" he found information on the Australian Grand Prix in the Goulburn Penny Post. He makes mention of it in this book on page 74. The book is available from the Goulburn Information Centre.

Subsequently David Manson saw the reference in "The Racing Boys", and researched it further, finding it to be correct. He then published an article in the Vintage Sports Car Club of Australia's magazine, "The Vintage Car", issue 1 of 2000.

Time passed and no one did anything about this. That was until a drivers meeting of the Golden Era Auto Racing Club Inc. (GEAR) on December 5, 2001, at Wakefield Park, when it was decided to commemorate this important event.

Between December 2001 and January 15, 2002 GEAR members, with the help of the then mayor, the late Max Hadlow, information service officer Scott Pollock, and many others, a special event for Goulburn was organised.

This event included a street display and parade of racing cars and other vehicles of the vintage era. The parade moved to the showground, where the first Grand Prix had been held. The event included the unveiling of the 75th anniversary plaque, a draft horse cavalcade and a fly past led by local Dick Nell. It emulated the first Grand Prix, which included horse events and a fly-over.

That evening a dinner was held at the Bowling Club and the following day, the usual fun filled drive day was held at Wakefield Park Race Circuit.

Five years later on January 14, 2007, GEAR arranged a similar event for the 80th Anniversary and the Goulburn Bowl was introduced to Wakefield Park. This was the inaugural running of the Goulburn Bowl (named with council approval) and is an hour long, regularity event for various categories of cars of the Golden Era.

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It has remained an annual event in January and keeps alive memories of the first Australian Grand Prix.

Again in 2012 Goulburn hosted celebrations with a display of historic racing cars, motorcycles and some replicas that ran in the 1927 event, and with music and open air cinema of the era in the park of an evening.

A two day event at Wakefield Park was held with more displays and track events, for both cars and bikes. It also featured the resurrection of the Bol d'Or, an event run initially between 1993 and 2004.

The next Tri-challenge event is the Ringwood Round on 22nd and 23rd June followed by the Tamworth Supersprint on 20th and 21st July.

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

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
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
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YOUNG DRIVER DEVELOPMENT COURSE DATES 2013
