

LAND PANEL Doug Rae

We are well under way with achieving our goal of extending the hillclimb thanks to the efforts of Allan Bates and his dedicated team of workers.

The final 100mm of gravel has been laid and a sealing surface of tar and gravel applied, which needs to be left for a fortnight to settle before the hotmix is laid early in June.

Work has been halted on the paddock areas due to the unseasonal inclement weather but hopefully this will clear up so the area can be consolidated and grassed.

Preparation for our hillclimb on 26th May was disrupted by the weather and only cleaning of toilets and such type of work was attempted along with work on the extensions. I remind you that once the tar is down a great deal of work will be required to put in place guard rail tyre barriers, tyre buffers, ripple strips, fences and generally tidy up the place in preparation for track inspections by both the police and CAMS to achieve our licence to compete on our new track. With this in mind we will be organising some Saturday working bees, so keep a eye on our website because we will need help. Some of these working bees have been held with quite a number of tyre buffers being built.

Our new shed is well under way to being fitted out with Glenn Parsonage building gates for the open section and a team under the direction of Paul Bower fitting out the workshop. An area is being levelled ready to place a 25000lt water tank and a power supply will be needed.

As at this time we have had 18 private practices and 6 track hires with interest in our new track extensions being expressed.





A GRAND HISTORY

THE FIRST AUSTRALIAN GRAND PRIX WINNER

To continue from the article of last month which established the true story of the first AGP which took place in Goulburn NSW on 15th January 1927. This month you will read of the mystery of the driver.

Who was Geoffrey Charles Edwin Meredith, winner of the first Australian Grand Prix?

Initially all that was known of the man was from an obituary in the Goulburn Penny Post dated June 29, 1928. From this it was gleaned that he was born about 1901/02.

Extensive research in Australian records failed to find a birth for Geoffrey Meredith. Was he born overseas? No one knew.


That was until a researcher checking the Queensland records came up with a Geoffrey Charles Edwin Cox, born September 16, 1901 at Beenleigh.

The parents were listed on the birth certificate as Henry James Cox and Marie nee McKay but it was found from their 1889 marriage that their surname was spelt Cocks.

The first records of Geoffrey appear in the Gehan (near Toowoomba) School attendance books with entries for Geoffrey Cocks from 1907 to 1912. He is next found in the admission register for Fifth Class at Brisbane Central Boys State School. Entry is dated Geoffrey Cox (with 'Cocks' written above it), date of birth 16.9.1901 and father noted as Henry Cocks of Salisbury (near Brisbane), Grazier.

If Geoffrey's birth certificate had needed to be produced for his admission, that would explain the use of the "Cox" spelling.

On November 9, 1922 Geoffrey Charles Edwin Cox signed a Change of Name Deed Poll renouncing the use of the surname and stating that he would henceforth use the surname Meredith.



His residence is given as "of Mitchell Plains near Cunnamulla". The Deed Poll was drawn up by solicitor EP Vallely of Cunnamulla and registered at the Qld Supreme Court on December 6, 1922. No reason has been found for why Geoffrey changed his surname, or for why the particular surname Meredith was chosen.

Nearly 3000 people attended the Goulburn Grand Prix races on January 15, 1927 which saw Meredith in the Bugatti T 30 as winner of the second heat, with Hope Bartlett placing second. Meredith then went on to win the Grand Prix, with Jack O'Rourke in second place.

In 1928, Meredith competed in six speedway races in Glasgow as well as an exhibition race at Celtic Park and he then left the group to travel to the Isle of Man to see the TT races.

There he succumbed to pneumonia and died in Nobels General Hospital. He was buried in the Borough Cemetery at Douglas, Isle of Man (located just behind the tower at the TT start line). In his Will, Meredith left everything to Vi McKay.




