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




Register Run On Sunday 11th August, 2013

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LAND PANEL Doug Rae

Work is proceeding on a variety of fronts.

The shed has had the downpipes fitted and with the current weather conditions our new water tank is over a quarter full. A trench has been dug between the shed and our toilet block and conduit placed in it to run electricity to the shed underground.

Sumps are being finished around the track and some extra pipes installed.

Filling is being placed in the paddock area to greatly raise the level and flatten it. Also a plan has been formulated and costed, and presented by Alan Bates at our Board meeting.

The hiring of our facility to Driving Solutions has been ongoing with the next booking on the31st July, which will make this the 9th booking this year. Discussions are taking place as regards Driving Solutions making our venue their permanent training grounds for this area.

No maintenance of grassed areas has been carried out as the weather has turned these into a bog.

At time of writing the paddock area has been filled and is in the process of being consolidated. Unfortunately a decision has been made that has caused our State Hillclimb Championship scheduled for the 4th August to be cancelled, which is disappointing for both competitors and organising officials.

On a brighter note drainage around the new extensions is all but completed. At the last working bee 60 metres of conduit was laid to take our timing and lighting cables throughout the track.

Keep a eye out for our next working bees as it might assist you in getting a place in our first events on the extension.

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FROM the pages of HISTORY by Judith Rae

The annual Gymkhana at Tony Easton's property at Gloucester was held and Peter Houghton was outright winner in his MGB. Later that year the first Gymkhana was held at our property at Nelsons Plains, outright winner was John Porter in a Morris 850.

CAMS advised that "Gymkhanas would in future be known as Driving Tests". In 1967 the club once again run a round of the State "Driving Test" at Metro Drive In at Gateshead. This time Greg Hunter was Outright winner in his Morris Cooper.

David Huck a long time member who had recently moved to Nigeria, sent the Club a sizeable donation, it was agreed to establish a perpetual Trophy to be presented annually and to be named the "David Huck Perpetual Trophy".

In 1968 a speed event to Amaroo Park Hillclimb attracted a record number of 53 entries. Despite the problems involved in running an event so far from home, the day went well. Fastest time went to Malcolm Bailey in the Elfin Peugeot. (The first of many trips away to places like Amaroo, Oran Park, Catalina and Warwick Farm).

Alan Barbour reported on a meeting called by HVSCC, proposing a new club be formed to develop a motor racing circuit. The new club to be known as "Newcastle Motor Racing Club" run by 2 delegates from the 6 local car clubs. Our delegates were named as Alan Barbour and Brian Lear. At the end of 1968 the club membership stood at 300.

A special meeting was held at Nelsons Plains to finalise a design for the sprint track. A proposal by MGCC (NSW) for a National Meeting of MG Car Clubs to be held in 1969 was supported by our Club.

In 1969 a draft constitution for NMRC was examined. At the AGM our delegate Alan Barbour was elected as Vice President. 500 railway sleepers was purchased from Richmond Main Colliery to be used in the construction of safety fencing at Nelsons Plains. A working bee was organise to transport the sleepers from Kurri Kurri, as well as finalise many unfinished jobs. Approx. 250 spectators and 78 competitors attended a meeting to Amaroo Park Dirt Sprint track

The many people that took office to steer the club in these early years did a wonderful job, some are still around and still working for the club, to name a few, J. McLaughlin, R. Edwards, J. Newey, G. Newey, J. Sullivan, P. Houghton, A. Barbour, L. Clarke, S. Collins, J. Collins, N. Saunders, G. Hunter, B. Lear, B. Baldwin, K. Lewis, N. Faulkner, K. Lear.

LAKE MACQUARIE CLASSIC 3

A Touring Road Event promoted by the MG Car Club

Guess what, not a lot has happened with regard to the asphalting.

Cold weather and rain has intervened again.

Work has begun on establishing a cleared boundary line.

Anyone who has been to Ringwood in the last month can see what has been achieved. What you can't see is the amount of work and hours spent attending to the drainage and general construction.

The work in the quarry is nearing completion. A track has been constructed around the southern and eastern perimeter. This should be useful when running dirt based events.

Work in the paddock area is progressing with about 2,500 tonne of fill taken from the quarry. Compaction and preparation of the area will continue.

The next phase after the paddock area is completed will be the rehabilitation of the access road and the construction of the new entry off Italia Road.

All going well, this should be completed in the next two to three weeks.
