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

Our new entry has been opened and it is approximately 100m further down Italia Rd. Hopefully we will have new signage up by the next event on the 22nd September.

The access road has been raised and drainage pipes put in place, and after consolidating will have road base laid and sealed through to the pit area.

A new spectator road has been built with extra pipes and drainage put in place. This is on the perimeter of the new paddock extensions which has doubled the parking area and allowed a more level area. The only sign of the 300mtrs of drainage pipes we have laid are the sumps to take surface water.

More working bees will be required for tyre barriers to be assembled, also spreading of top soil in the paddock and grassing.

The contractors have finished their work and now it is up to the members of the club to tidy up the venue and make it the best in NSW if not Australia. It is up to you. We still have a long way to go before the track is licensed and up and running. Good luck with this as those of us who have been spending from 3 to 5 days a week for the past 6 months are well and truly exhausted.



56th Annual Mattara Hillclimb

FROM the pages of HISTORY by Judith Rae

1970 saw Treasurer Ian Faulkner hand in his resignation from Committee owing to a transfer to Melbourne with his job. Kay Lear took over the position. President Alan Barbour advised that the laying of Gravel at Nelsons Plains was almost complete and the only things left to do was to finish the safety fences and complete the Toilet Block and an application for the Licence can be applied for.

The first of the Annual MG Car Club National Meeting hosted by MGCC (NSW- Sydney) saw the sporting activities conducted at Amaroo Park and the Concours at Vaucluse House,

After a very successful trial of providing food and drinks at the January Motorkhana, it was decided to erect a permanent facility at Nelsons Plains. The owner of Stuart Drum Co. who was also a member of the club offered 2000 gallons of waste oil per month for use at Nelsons Plains. This started a roster of a few willing workers to drive to Carrington to pick up the truck, drive to Nelsons Plains and spread the oil to consolidate the track and lay the dust.

Mick Neilson assisted by Peter Houghton directed the MG 300 Rally which was also round 2 of the NSW Rally Championship. It attracted a field of 20 Expert and 43 Clubman entries and was most successful. Treasurer Kay Lear reported that due to some heavy expenditure with the purchase of a duplicator, 12 months supply of paper, and gravel for Nelsons Plains Track, the bank balance had fallen to \$269.56. (Heavens how did we survive.)

The Club's first Lap Dash at Catalina Park Katoomba attracted 36 entries. (We did lots of travelling in those days. I forgot to mention Silverdale Hillclimb last month in our trips away.)

The Track Licence for Nelsons Plains was received from The Chief Secretary's Dept. on 5/11/1970. The first Sprint was held as a Club event, open only to members who had qualified by attending working bees to help build the Track. (Sound familiar?) Our Secretary received a phone call from Pt. Stephens Council that the club had never applied for a DA. An application was quickly submitted and a call to Milton Morris (Minister for Transport) to put in a good word for us and the approval was received on 24/12/70.



A momentus day in the life of a car The Liberty reaches Half a Million Kilometres

A momentous day in the life of my wonderful Liberty RS Turbo as it turned over 500,000km today in Beaumont Street Hamilton.

A few fact's below.

- > Purchased from Regal Motors (at their original site Tudor Street Hamilton) on January 22nd (a Wednesday) 1992.
- > Purchase price around \$45,000. Therefore around 11 cents per km so far.
- > Stolen and recovered on four separate occasions including once when it was pushed around the corner out of sight and abandoned, and another time when it was involved in a high speed pursuit north of Raymond Terrace.
- > Driven to Outright 1st place at a MG Car Club Nelsons Plains dirt sprint when it had just 1500km on the clock.
- > So some relevant stats; Assuming average speed of 65 kph for its life that means either Madelon or I have been in it for 7,936 and a half hours over a period of 7,872 days, a bit over an hour a day give or take, and every day the car has done an average of 63km.
- > Numerous road trips however probably the most substantial was to the Gulf Country and Daintree in the space of 3 weeks back in 94.
- > Couple of minor incidents where trucks have tried to mount her from behind but she survived with her dignity intact just fine.
- > One head on assault by an Australian Marsupial which she also survived and even got us home....the Marsupial was not so lucky!
- > An errant Mother in Law who attempted murder by backing a Dodge Phoenix into her, she got home from Harvey Bay after that indecent assault from a Yank (referring to the Dodge off course).
- > Serviced by Subaru Dealers (Regal in Newcastle, Autocare in Coffs Harbour) until 100,000 after which exclusively serviced by John Collins Dyno Tune, now known as Newcastle Dyno Centre. Service interval since 100,000 each 5,000km.

Service and repairs that I can remember;

> Two clutches, one forced on her after she was involved in the high speed



pursuit.

- > Gearbox repair after another of the stolen and recovered incidents.
- > One reartail light.
- > Head gasket failure after a water hose let go on the Freeway. My very clever wife shut her down before the Liberty destroyed herself trying to keep up to the speed the cruise control was set at. This was at about 350,000km and the manufacturing hone marks where still visible in the bores.
- > Fuel pump replaced.
- > Front brake pads at 172,500 and again on schedule at 345,000. I guess they will be due again in about 15,000km. Rear Pads at 242,500 and the second set are still going, none of the discs have needed machining yet.

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A Couple of Ideas

Toolbox

I've always had a problem with tools when we go touring or racing. I have to strip my shadowboard at home, put them into a bag and then I've usually forgotten the one that's needed. I decided that I need a mobile shadowboard that fits the TR

So I put this toolkit together: The shadowboards are hinged so they fold out and can either sit on the ground if you're working under the car or on a stand for work under the bonnet. When closed, it can be carried on the handgrips with little effort by one person. It folds up and fits behind the fuel tank, thus taking up minimal boot space - when


packed back it only encroaches on the boot by a couple of inches. To stop the tools rattling, a piece of material is needed between the boards - so tuck your overalls in there and they are then ready for use. A colour coding suggested by Geoff Byrne will soon be put in place as well.

Easy to read manuals and wallcharts

It's worth remembering that Officeworks have an excellent printing service which can be very useful to those of us who are optically challenged. They can print enlarged copies of documents for very reasonable prices: I recently got a copy of the TR 2 Part Manual







(over 200 pages) printed in A3 size - much larger and easier to read than normal - for the price of a good bottle of Scotch.

Similarly if a major component rebuild is taking place, Officeworks offer an A0 plan printing service. This can blow a normal A4 page up to over a metre square and can be used as a wall chart. Recently, Doug Brodie rebuild some Weber carbs for me - I was able to give him a wall chart of the complete exploded diagram for easy reference. It works for a cutaway diagram or assembly chart, thus providing a giant drawing for easy reference - and they look good as well. A line drawing such as a cutaway can be printed for less than \$3. A poster with pictures included (see photo) is less than \$10. The photo shows a page of Motor Sport in original size, A3 and A0.

Toucan Toe- in Gauge

Front ends of TRs are pretty fixed. We can't fiddle with the camber, nor the castor, so all we can do set the toe - in. But setting this needs a gauge to do it right. This one was easy to build - see the photo. Key is one piece of tube that fits in another, both about a meter bng. Weld on two pieces of angle or



square to allow the top bolts to be half wheel height above the ground (300 mm). Drill a hole, weld a nut on, stick a bolt in the nut and weld a bit of scrap on top as a handle.

Use is easy - straighten the steering wheel, rest the tubes on the ground and touch the top bolts on the wheel rims - first the front, then the back, measure it up and fiddle the front links as needed. Toucan? That's because you'll drink about two cans in the time it takes to make it!.

True story: It takes two people to operate, so Danute, expert wife and mechanic, came to help. We were both lying under the car, only our legs sticking out, when our next door neighbour called. He took one look, said "...oh.... excuse me!..." and just about ran down the drive. I'm not sure what he thought we were doing but I don't think it was setting the toe-in!

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RINGWOOD PROJECT REPORT

This is the eighth report to the members on the progress.

Well it has finally happened, the major earthworks are complete.

The clearing of the boundary line is complete and so is our new crossing from Italia Road

The access road has been reworked and we now need to let the road settle and compact for a while before any further work is envisaged.

We will wait for the asphalt to be laid before any sealing work is carried out on the access road.

Those that can remember what the quarry looked like will be shocked to see the new and much enlarged area. Approx. 3000 cubic metres of fill was removed and used in the construction of the extension and rehabilitation of the access road and paddock area.

The paddock area is nearing completion and there is a new access road to the spectator area.
