Drivers Training course. I think you would have to agree a busy club! So let's not forget all those people who make it happen & maybe even get involved yourself.



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

ising costs including CAMS permit fees dictated an increase in Sprint entry fees to \$8 (an increase of \$2.50) The club opened negotiations with 2HD to once again sponsor the Mattara Hillclimb for 1976.

The committee accepted the proposal by Doug Rae and Howard MacLean to have the track at Nelsons Plains rebuilt before the next sprint. The overall cost would be \$2000 including additional gravel. The work was carried out by member Malcolm Bailey. The MG National Meeting was hosted by MGCC Tasmania over Easter, The mid year Cabaret was held at Kahibah Bowling Club as a benefit night, portion of the proceeds was donated to "House with No Steps". Club membership at the end of June was 313.

The Driver Training Range was once again the venue for an advanced driving course with lectures held over 5 evenings. As in previous years the course culminated with practical lessons at the Sprint Track at Nelsons Plains. Negotiations with 2HD

broke down and WD & HO Wills accepted an offer to sponsor the Mattara Hillclimb.

Following representation from the Club, Newcastle City Council expended \$6000 for hotmix sealing of large areas of King Edward Park. The result being one of the smoothest events held at this venue with only minor delays. The most notable was when Ian Best smashed his Fiat 600 through the safety fence dropping 50ft down the cliff with only the lantana stopping him from dropping onto the rocks below.

To wind the year up Doug Rae was presented with Life membership for his service to the club over many years (and many more to come), The David Huck Perpetual Trophy was awarded to Chris Dodds. Speed events during the year averaged around 40 competitors. On the social scene the theatre parties continued to be popular including several live performances at the Civic Theatre. The Mid Year Cabaret at Kahibah Bowling Club was the best attended for some time.

Progress at Ringwood.

An inspection on the 3rd March resulted in a few issues being raised with regard to track safety.

A couple of weeks of research, proposals and much debate, has resulted in a resolution to the new requirements.

Materials have been arranged and work has continued with a firm direction now on the table.

The inspection outcome was not what was initially expected, however the outcome will result in a much safer track and environment, not only for the competitors but for the spectators as well.

The comment made by the track inspector of "It's too late to build the

barrier after the accident" has been taken on board and we are getting on with the suggestions.

By the time the next event is run at Ringwood, those that attend will see the improvements made for the benefit of the membership in general.

I, and the Board believe that we are building a first class venue that will not only be enjoyable to competitors but spectators as well.

At the moment there are a couple of groups (committees) that have been put in place by the Board.

One is to bring about the efficient running of the AHCC in November while the other group operating independently of the AHCC Committee is to ensure the track and facilities are in place to allow the running of this event. At the moment a large portion of this work is being carried out by DAD's Army on their usual Thursday working bees. If you have the time to attend any of these days, or any of the extra working bees advertised on the web site or in the club magazine, please contact myself, Doug Rae, Bryn Baverstock or Rick Vincent. I'm sure we can find a place for you at the lunch table.

LAND PANEL REPORT

n the plus side all our containers are off IRH's property with one being resited with a new roof, some roofing sheets need to be brought onto our side and then the road needs closing with our temporary fencing.

The pit/paddock area has been graded and some rocks removed this will be ongoing until grassed and prepared for the access roads to be sealed

The top flag point construction is ongoing with consideration to protecting the officials from inclement weather being put in place and steps constructed.

Six lengths of guardrail were removed from exit turn 3 to be repositioned drivers left turn 6.

Our last working bee concentrated on tyre bundles which are nearly finished with the next project being to fix belting to the face of the bundles and anchor the lot to the guardrail.

Some changes to the area approaching the finish chute is to be attended to and a safety wall at the end of the finish straight will be constructed.

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

I would like to ask members if they could verify if their CAMS Official Accreditation is current, if they are not sure could they check with CAMS, I can supply a renewal form, if they have their Officials Pass Book up to date.

We are desperate for Officials, so please check your current accreditation, also we intend to arrange Training Courses this year, so if you can assist please contact me, as we need extra officials for the new Ringwood track.

I was lucky to attend this years Grand Prix with my sons, very expensive few days, but it was worth it, three days of Motor Sport with an AFL match thrown in just to confuse all of us.

We were fortune enough to gain grandstand seats on corner 16 prior to pit straight, with supplied earphones an audio of the commentary and large video screens we gained knowledge of the new specification for the Formula 1 cars.

Most of you Formula 1 fans will know most of the following information, but for those select few that don't, I thought I may supply the following.

Comparing last years V8 with 800 BHP with this years 600 BHP, its hard to really compare, except to say they have changed every thing, from the V8 down to a 1.6 litre V6 and a single turbo with around 50 PSI boost, sounds like Kevin Edwards Evo, an upgrade to the KERS system now known as ERS has considerably assisted in

gaining power, controlling it is another matter.

All these changes including the aerodynamics of the new body makes the car extremely hard to control, as Vettel found out during the practice sessions, and of course there is the new rule relating to the amount of fuel each car can consume during the whole race, set at 100 kg this means that the more fuel efficient the car or team can be, the greater the chances of winning a podium position.

Anyway its all good fun, as it

places a lot more effort on the drivers skill to handle these God Dam Rockets.

The telephone number of Abingdon (251) provided the starting point for most MG's chassis VINs (Vehicle Identification Numbers). Production TF and Magnette ZAs use a 101 VIN start code. In keeping with tradition, this number came from the Birmingham headquarters telephone number.
