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Yes, at last we have a new logo; one which reflects the independent nature of our Club, but still represents the fundamental reasons for the Club's existance. A relatively simple and uncluttered logo was chosen, but there are significant reasons for the various features of the design.

They are:

- A) It is a balanced design, centred about the initials "M.G.", just as our club is balanced about the central theme of the M.G. Marque.
- B) The 'open' octagon surrounding the MG initials is significant in two ways. Firstly it indicates that the club is NOT closed to MG owners only and secondly, you may have already noticed, it forms an octagonal 'C' for competition, again centred around the MG Marque.
- C) Obviously the name NEWCASTLE MG CAR CLUB is very important to us and this design leaves no doubt about that aspect.
- D) The octagonal border is there to reinforce the MG theme. It is obvious that the 'Octagon' is a multi-sided figure, just as our club is one which covers the widest range of activities covered by the interest in MC cars, Motorsport and social activities.

A secondary design has also been adopted to be used where it's shape is appropriate. It also covers all the above design criterion.

ur home grown YDDC conducted by the MGCCN is starting to come of age; the course which commenced in 2000 will celebrate its 15th

year in February.

Many things have changed during the 15 years; the original course not only catered for students under the age of 18 years, the original concept included seniors as well.

Over the years between 2000/03, the senior's participation rate grew at an exceptionally fast rate, so much so, that it became apparent after 3years that it was no longer practical to accept senior and junior students in a combined program. Records show numbers of 40 plus were not unusual.

Looking back, I am amazed how we ever coped with such large numbers of students. Along came the CAMS Come & Try format, now it was possible to involve senior students into a training programme that was totally specific to their needs.

I have vivid memories of certain drivers who shall remain unnamed, they though it was fair game to give instructors the fright of their lives. Eventually the seniors learnt that just by slowing down a little, they would actually go faster, Thank God, these terrifying experiences appear to have mellowed, if not disappeared altogether.

For those of you who are new to our club, those who have not yet participated in a motor sport, COME & TRY event, please read the information ad-

vert elsewhere in this issue of Club Torque. The event will be held on Sunday 8th of March, meanwhile for more information ring me on 0412493711.

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FIFTY BOB

oth the November and December Clubtorque magazines have featured a strange looking polished aluminium and blue painted veteran sports car. That car is the 1914 Vauxhall known as Fifty Bob.

The "A" type Vauxhall was introduced in 1910, but the factory special, chassis number A210 was made in 1914. The chassis number, years later, giving Hope Bartlett the chance to try to denigrate the car as just 50 bobs worth (or two pound ten in the currency of the time) when it beat his new Bugatti.

The car made a name for itself by competing very strongly and frequently winning all types of motorsport events, before and after the First World War.

Boyd Edkins was not only a very capable driver of the car but capitalised on the advertising value of motorsport by sometimes changing the body on the car to surprise the press and other competitors.

Hill climbs, circuit events, reliability trails, speedway and intercity runs were all success stories for Edkins and Fifty Bob.

The times that Fifty Bob achieved



breaking the Artillery Hill record, on the Heathcote Road south of Sydney are difficult to achieve even today in a modern car on the sealed bitumen road.

In 1916 Edkins lowered the Sydney to Melbourne record to 15 hours with the car.

The specifications of the car were not unique for the era but the balance and coherence of the components resulted in performance, handling and reliability which were outstanding for the time and even noteworthy today.

The engine is a three litre, four cylinders with non detachable head and dual ignition with eight spark plugs. The breathing is enhanced by a large Claudel Hobson barrel throttle carburettor and four into one fabricated tube exhaust manifold. The valve timing features some overlap at top dead centre (unusual for the time) and an amazing twelve mm of valve lift, made possible by roller cam followers. Crank handle start of course, as only Cadillac's had electric self starters in 1914.

The transmission begins with an enclosed multi plate metal to metal clutch that is lubricated with graphite powder; there is a clutch brake to quicken the up changes. The gearbox is four speeds, non synchromesh, with second gear a delight to use for all those interesting corners. Torque tube drive to the final drive ensures

that all possible weight is transferred to the rear wheels to improve traction on the unsealed roads that the car was designed for. Similar drive line to a modern Sprintcar.

The chassis was shortened and front wheel brakes were added in 1923 to keep ahead of the newer post war models. The car continued to race up until the late 1950s when finally cars like the new MG A could see it off.

The car was featured at the 2014 Australian hill climb championships because of the connection with hill climbing and the coincidence of its 100th birthday. This was news worthy enough to achieve front page photos and editorials in the Saturday Newcastle Herald; the articles mentioned Ringwood and the Australian hill climb championship.

At 100 years of age Fifty Bob is still getting people interested in Motor Sport!

The Herald article along with local media of all types, organised by other members of MGCC of Newcastle, attracted a good turnout of spectators at Ringwood; some seeing hill climbing for the first time.

Entrants will walk the track where comments on approaching and leaving corners will be given, where to brake and other valuable information.

You don't need a fancy competition car you can just bring the shopping car. Just relax and have some fun we will take care of all the CAMS paperwork.
