BECOMING AN OFFICIAL

s there is no Register Run report for this month. I thought I would take the opportunity to use the space and submit a little bit about becoming a CAMS Official.

There has been a lot of discussions about the need for the MGCCN seeking member assistance with Officials. But, how do you become an official??

Well, as I and Yvonne have both recently undertaken some on-line training to become CAMS Officials, both of us have done our Official Trainee and I have just this month completed my Bronze Circuit Official training, I thought I'd share some points on how to become a CAMS Official.

BECOMING AN OFFICIAL

Most people know what a Flag Marshal does, but do you know what Scrutineers, Stewards, Event Secretaries, Grid Marshals and Recovery Officials do? These are just some of the interesting roles that officials fulfil at motor sport events and that you could become involved in.

The CAMS' National Officiating Program (NOP) facilitates the training and accreditation of volunteer motor sport officials. New officials start off with a CAMS Trainee Licence, and are teamed with experienced officials and learn how to do most things on the job. As an official you will gain more experience and begin to take on more responsibilities, you will be given the op-

portunity to upgrade your licence and branch out into other areas of officiating.

CAMS also run various training courses for the different categories of officials. A flow chart to the various official levels is also published for you to have a look at.

WHO CAN OFFICIATE?

Anyone with a general interest in motor sport can become a volunteer official. Minimum age restrictions apply for some roles and activities and there are also supervision requirements for the different grades of officials.

All CAMS motor sport events including club events, state championships, Formula 1 Grand Prix and Bathurst 1000, cannot exist without volunteer officials that work at these events. You can become a CAMS Official in two easy steps:

- * Successfully complete a 30 minute online theory module, and
- * Attend a one day event as a trainee to see what role/s you are interested in.

From here you can attend events, officiate and consider a range of training courses to undertake for FREE under the CAMS National Officiating Program (NOP).

Step 1: Trainee Officials Licence

Download your CAMS Trainee Officials Licence before you attend your chosen event and take it with you. Make sure you get your Trainee Officials Licence signed by your supervisor or senior official at the end of the event.

You will then be required to lodge this form with CAMS Customer Service.

(The e-mail address is on the form)

Upon receipt of this form CAMS will allocate you with your CAMS Member number and you will be contacted regarding Step 2 of the process to becoming a General Official.

Step 2: Introductory Theory Module

To ensure that you are duly informed and aware of the potential dangers of motor sports, you are required to undertake a short Training Induction Module. This is a basic introduction to the CAMS policies, procedures, and general safety working in, on and around race tracks. This is done on-line with your user name and password from CAMS.

You will receive via e-mail a log on "user name" and "password". The password can be changed if you wish once you have logged in. Be sure to record you user name and password.

Follow the prompts, which will lead you through the course.

Step 3: Apply for a General Officials Licence

Once you have completed the Introductory Theory Module your General Official Licence will be forwarded to you.

The CAMS web site can be a little overwhelming and often confusing particularly if you are new to motor sport and are not familiar with the anonyms. If you have problems email CAMS- at memberservices@cams.com.au.

If you have any questions or need some advice, please do not hesitate in speaking to one of the Club Officials.

As I have found out personally, some of the procedures, track talk and official jargon, is often taken as 'assumed' knowledge. If you're not sure what language is being spoken, just let us know, and I am very sure the Club and members will realise and be very accommodating.

2015 MG NATIONAL MEETING YARRA VALLEY, VICTORIA EASTER, 3RD TO 7TH APRIL

small group of MG enthusiasts from MG Newcastle travelled to the Yarra Valley, Victoria, to attend the 2015 MG National Meeting, for a week-end of friendship and competition.

Total entries for the meeting were just over 360 people - 190 competitors and 160 social with some 170 MGs. In total 15 MG Centres represented with reps from all states.

In our MG Newcastle group there were 24 people with 12 cars that included MGTC (Phil Redhead and Ross Taylor), MGA (Bruce Fraser), MGB (David Walker), MGBGT (Andrew and Jenna Fraser), MG1100 (Dale Powell), MGF (Lyall Clarke and John Collins), MGZS (Ken Short, John & Naomi Fraser) and MGZR (Darren Hodgson & Doug Rae, Louise & Alexander Reeves). Social entrants were Marta Redhead, Marjorie Taylor, Beth Fraser, Lesley Walker, Kerry Woollard, Robyn Short, Judith Rae, Jan Clarke & Rose Cogger-Collins, Martin & Michelle Reeves tagged along during the day.

Most of us left on the Wednesday before Easter and arrived in our Motel in Healesville on Thursday afternoon where much time was spent cleaning cars in readiness for the weekend's competition.

After registration on Good Friday (some

25 kms away) it was back to the motel for more preparation for the Concours. A few members took the opportunity to have a look at Rob Roy but most were still cleaning.

Friday evening was the Noggin n Natter night which was held at the MG Victoria's excellent Clubrooms in Nunawading (40 kms from our motel).

Highlight of the night was the Rocker Cover Racing which proved to be an excellent result for our club with John Collins taking out 1st Place.

Saturday was the Concours held at Rochford Wines in perfect weather. It proved to be an excellent venue and was the only one close to our motel.

174 MGs were presented to the judges with Darren taking out 1st in the ZR class and others taking minor placings. It was a magnificent display of all models with some fine examples exhibited.

After the Concours it was back to the motel to prepare for Sunday's Hillclimb at Rob Roy or the Observation Run. Some went to MG Victoria's clubrooms for a Roast Dinner while others dined locally.

Sunday dawned fine and clear and fit was an early start for some to Rob Roy Hillclimb (about 26 kms away) -7.30am drivers briefing and 8am start. The rest could sleep in a bit for the 12noon call.

Rob Roy is an interesting venue beginning in 1937 and running until a devastating bushfire in 1962. MGCC Victoria resurrected it in 1993 and the track is now in regular use. The start line is dominated by a pair of enormous brake shoes that were rescued after the closure of Templestowe Hillclimb. The climb itself can be described as a power hill, with no braking except at the finish. The start is slightly uphill into a right hander which then dives over a causeway and into a steep section with a left hander (slightly blind entry) that goes on and on then across the finish line. The track length is similar to our current Ringwood track, about 720 metres, but by comparison, my car (MGF) does Ringwood around 47 seconds where my time a Rob Roy was 28.47seconds - much faster and on the rev limiter several times in second gear. Many of our drivers were well placed in their respective classes, with John Fraser and Darren Hodgson being fastest in their classes. We all enjoyed this event and can now tick Rob Roy off our bucket list.

A free night followed at our motel and the local pizza driver was extremely pleased with his delivery to us.

Monday, Motorkhana Day, was also blessed with good weather. This made the organisers very happy as the venue was the METC Driver Training Centre with 2 of events set up on expanses of bitumen. However, the other event was on a concrete skidpan that had recently been increased in size with some new concrete. This event proved a real challenge as from the start line you thought it was slippery, but when you went on to

the new concrete it was super slippery with little or no grip. It made for some interesting driving with many cars spinning or failing to stop in the garage.

Again we had many good results from our drivers with Bruce Fraser, John Collins, John Fraser, and Darren Hodgson all securing a first place, and many others with a second or third.

Monday evening was Presentation Night in the suburb of Ringwood and again, it was a very good venue. Our small team featured well throughout the Presentation of awards, with the highlights being Darren Hodgson winning the Cecil Kimber Centennial Trophy, which is for the highest points by an individual competitor in all events.

The final announcement of the night is always for the overall outright trophies and the excitement was building.

This is the second time they have won this trophy for this car. Hopefully not one that will be repeated again! Very fortunately, apart from severe bruising particularly to Jenna's leg, they are both OK. In fact they borrowed Andrew's brothers MGBGT and drove to Victoria to compete. Andrew got a 2nd in

the Hillclimb and Motorkhana, while Jenna got a 3rd in the Motorkhana. Good stuff!!

Andrew emailed me a couple of days ago with a photo of a new Midget that they have bought, so they will soon be back into competition.


