A very good effort considering the conditions on the day, congratulations to all competitors, a special thank you to John Roach being the Secretary for the event.



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Australian Competition Vehicles

Veskanda

Thirty years ago a sports car known as the Veskanda was built, raced and developed in Australia. For much of the ensuing years this car was widely recognised as Australia's fastest race car.

During the 1980's Australians were regularly a part of the Le mans 24 hour sports car race. Stemming from this, Sandown Park in Victoria announced it was to host a round of the World Sports Car Championship in 1984 for the next three years. So on the 2^{nd} December the now legendary all dominant Rothmans Porsche factory team and the rest of the WSC set competed in the final round of the series at Sandown.

This inspired Adelaide photographer Bernard Van Elsen to approach K&A Engineering to construct an Australian built sports car to compete in the 1985 Sandown race and also the Australian Sports car championship. K&A Engineering was conceived and operated by former Elfin race engineer Dale Koennecke and Harry Aust. K&A had previous experience with numerous projects, including the complete redesign of the Bolwell Nagaro for racing, however, had never designed and constructed a ground effects car before. Fortunately two friends of Harry Aust's, John and Bob Murphy, had just returned to Adelaide from the U.S with a lot of first-hand practical knowledge from working with the VDS CanAm sports car team.

K&A designed the car to conform to the Australian Sports car rules of the day and also the Group C and IMSA sports car regulations at the time. Thus the car had the IMSA-spec double front bulkhead and double rollover hoops, accompanied by the 100-litre fuel cell and laminated glass screen (rather than polycarbonate) for the coupe cockpit as required by Group C. Group C also dictated the overall width (2.0m), and the track, as was the relationship between the wheelbase (2.71m) and overall length (4.8m). Minimum weight was also set by Group C at 850kg, which the Veskanda failed to achieve. The ground-effect features by specifying a minimum area of flat surface on the underside of the car contributed to this difficulty. At this time carbon fibre was in its very formative years overseas, so the monocoque tub was made from Aluminium, with the honeycomb ground-effects venturis and bulkheaded side pontoons providing added stiffness. All metal fabrication was done at K&A, much of it by a gentleman by the name of Greg Mobbs. K&A also made moulds for the Veskanda's bodywork with fibre glassing work undertaken from local Adelaide specialists.

Much of the car's mechanicals were sought from Formula 5000 as a Lola T332 was purchased for the use of the 5-litre fuel-injected alloy-head Chev V8, a DG300 gearbox,

front and rear uprights, steering, brakes and instruments.

Upon completion all reports are that the car was immaculate causing many to believe there were no budgetary constraints. The truth was the build was spread over 11 months, money was tight and there were no major sponsors. K&A gave great value on the project. Van Elsen, as car owner/financier, was left to consider a name for the vehicle but chose to name it after the constructors K&A (Veskanda) acknowledging the high quality work produced.

John Bowe, the then current Australian Drivers Champion, was engaged to drive the car however to some disappointment Sandown cancelled the scheduled WSC rounds for 1985 and 86 due to the financial losses of the 1984 race. The Veskanda debuted in August 1985 with The Australian Sports Car Championship pacesetters being Terry Hook's Lola T610 and Chris Clearihan's Kaditcha. Very light on development Bowe in the Veskanda beat them both and the die was cast for 1986 when the Veskanda dominated and from mid-season was upgraded to a 5.8 litre engine from when it won every round, sports car and two outright track lap records. One can only imagine what a thrill this car must have been to drive at places like Lakeside and Oran Park.

In 1988 the World Sports Car Championship would return to Sandown and at long last the Veskanda would get the chance to compete against the world's best in what inspired it's conception over 4 years earlier. Driving duties were undertaken by Bowe and his Shell Sierra teammate/boss Dick Johnson (I took even more interest as these guys were who I supported in Australian Touring car Racing).

The car was upgraded with a 6 litre engine to fight against the might of the Silk Cut Jaguars and Sauber Mercedes WSC teams. The Veskanda's pace was confirmed when it qualified 8th of the 18 car field and within 0.6 second of a top 5 grid spot. I clearly remember watching the race on TV and from memory it went fairly well for Johnson and Bowe, finishing 8th. They were rubbed out from the results due to the car using more than the maximim fuel allowed (by this time WSC rules included fuel restrictions) but from where I sat it did not matter that much.

Is it still Australia's fastest race car. I'm not sure, but apart from arguably the Bathurst 24 Hour Monaro's, I have not witnessed a designed and built Australian Sports Car race against the rest of the world.

Well as everyone is aware of by now, the 5th June Khanacross did not happen due to the "East coast Low". The weather was terrible on the weekend and could have been dangerous with competitors doing both tests bringing mud onto the hillclimb circuit after a run and those only contesting the bitumen sections finding mud after their previous runs on the same corner where the track was clean.
