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PRESIDENTS REPORT

The "Mattara Hillclimb" started very slowly with a decision almost made to pull the pin altogether on the Monday prior to the close of entries, however it appears that about 55% of the eventual entrants were asleep as to the closing date. A third of the field left it until the Wednesday that entries closed to bother entering.

This makes it extremely difficult for event organisers to make the many arrangements that must happen for an event of this public nature. Anyhow it all came together (eventually). We ended up with a big entry list of 69 before they started to fall away for various reasons.

Saturday saw 61 sign-on, for what was a morning of wet runs. Thankfully by midday the weather had cleared, and the track dried quickly so that the final 3 runs of the day were much more competitive. Four records were broken including the Outright record during the afternoon.

Sunday was a far more enjoyable day weather wise, being fine all day, and track A4 proved to be a bit more difficult to break records on. However, both James Pearson and Frank Mangano were able to complete the double for the weekend, breaking their respective Class records on both Track A2A and A4 on consecutive days. Well done! On a positive note, the promised upgrade to the standard of presentation at Ringwood was up and running, with the new digital display giving spectators and drivers timely information about the time just set. A permanent mounting for the display box is now to be constructed to make it easy to place and remove at each event.

I must thank the few dedicated officials who came out to help run the event over the weekend, it was good to see a t least a couple of new faces in the line up too. A big thanks to Libby Fernance for the work she put in again running the Canteen, while Chris had to fit in restocking runs into the Terrace between his runs in the event.

Rose Collins had great success in her efforts to get the event some publicity with articles in 3 of the main papers in the days leading up to the event, and 2NUR FM radio gave us good coverage, it is just a shame the weather on Saturday wasn't what we had hoped for.

Again, Joy Bower and her team provided excellent lunch packs to the officials on both days, thank you for that.

This year sponsorships were down a bit, but the same loyal sponsors were there again supporting the Club, without them the event trophies would not be of a standard befitting an event of this status.

Last but far from least, I thank the competitors, without them there would be no show! The 2020 October Long weekend will see us running the final round of the Tri-Challenge Series and at this stage we will probably drop the Friday Practice day as it requires the full crew of officials but over the last 2 years has only been utilised by relatively few competitors, a lot of effort for little return!

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PRESIDENTS REPORT

Hillclimbs being deemed a "Speed Event" by CAMS will have a new safety requirement from January 1, 2020. That is the requirement for a HANS device in certain vehicles. We are still trying to get a more complete set of details from CAMS on what the vague words in Schedule D 1.4 of the current CAMS Manual actually means. However, it looks like unless you are using a fully road registered car with a lap sash belt, you will need to have a FHR (Frontal Head Restraint) device fitted.

This requires a helmet that will accommodate the tethers and a harness that works with the system, so if you are in the group that require these items you should put in your orders for Christmas presents!! Paul Bower has been talking to CAMS and I have asked that he do an article for Clubtorque that should give more detail.

While on the topic of CAMS, those of you with a Competition or Officials Licence will probably have received an email advising that "CAMS" will become "Motorsport Australia" on 1st January 2020. The cynics among us will be wondering what damage they are going to do to Club level motorsport with this being yet another case of wanting to be seen as a grand organisation. I fear that despite all the rhetoric, Melbourne will concentrate even more on the top end of the sport and offer little to the people at Club level. I guess we will just have to wait and see!

You will have received the documentation relating to the AGM in the October magazine, please make an effort to come along to this most important meeting or at least if you are a full member complete the Proxy Voting Form. More importantly put your name on a Board nomination form, (also in the Magazine) because there are a few of us on the Board who won't be standing for election, so the big question is, who is going to step up for the various Board positions at the AGM. Wouldn't it be great (even if unusual) for the members present to have to decide who they wanted in each position!! The Audited 2018/19 Financial Year reports will be presented by our treasurer. This is your best chance to hear how your Club is faring financially. I will also have to do the usual Presidents Report (or summary) on the past year' activities. (YAWN!!!) Work on organising the 2022 MG National Meeting has commenced. The event will be based at Club Macquarie for registrations and functions with Ringwood the obvious venue for the Speed event, the Motorkhana and Concours venues remain to be locked in.

The RMS review of the Historic Car Log Book scheme has been completed and they have advised that from 1 October 2019, the Log Book will become a permanent feature of the Historic and Classic Vehicle Schemes. Transport for NSW will deliver several improvements to the schemes over the next 12 months based on the feedback received during the review.

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PRESIDENTS REPORT

Existing requirements introduced during the Trial will continue to apply to participants, including: -

Vehicles registered under the Historic and Classic Vehicle Schemes can be operated for 60 days of general road use each year, outside of club organised events.

Each day of general use must be recorded in a Log Book issued at Service NSW branches. Owners wishing to opt into the Log Book program should be a member of a Transport for NSW recognised Classic or Historic Vehicle Club, or Approved Organisation participating in the Log Book program.

While on the subject of Historic Registration, I must remind members that while we are very liberal in applying the requirement to attend Club outings and events, the one chance to show off your pride and joy, is to bring it along to the Club's Annual Concours and "Pride of Ownership Day". This will be held on Sunday November 3rd based at the Club Rooms in Cobby Street, Shortland and the adjacent Park. This is a great opportunity to get together with people who really enjoy their cars free of the risks associated with Motorsport Competitions. You don't have to submit your car to judging if you don't wish to.

This was traditionally an MG focussed event and I certainly hope to see a large assembly of the Marque present, but there are many interesting vehicles hidden away in garages across the region, so it would be great to see them too. I believe we have over 150 cars on Historic Plates on the register. Even if 1/3 of those were to turn out it would make for an impressive display, so come on everyone let's do it!

The competition year is winding down and apart from the Concours there are still 2 more Club Championship events in which you can pick up points that might just get you on the honours list at the Presentation Night which this year is on Saturday Night December 7th, still at Cardiff RSL. This is our biggest social event of the year and it is your chance to join in and honour our Champions for the 2019 year and have fun doing so.

A small group took advantage of the Friday practice session and opportunity to get Scrutineering out of the way. Practice was incident free and everyone there was looking forward to the event proper.

Saturday morning saw the sky heavily clouded over and by the time we got started at 9.00 am rain was imminent and rain it did! There were a couple of periods when the Clerk of the Course determined that the track was too wet to allow cars on slick tyres to run. There were many brave souls who did take on the A2A Course in the wet and had fun doing it. Thankfully by midday the sky was brighter and by 12.30 pm things were looking good for the rest of the day. This year there were eight classes with 5 or more competitors, so this made for strong competition. There were six lady drivers which is a significant increase on the numbers involved in the past. There were some close results there as well, despite the cars driven being from different classes.

Frank Mangano, Tim Blake and James Pearson all broke their respective Class records during the afternoon. I believe the award for the most spectacular run would have to go to James Pearson who took the mighty Mazda to 3rd outright behind Frank and Dave Morrow. There were many close contests and it would take too much space to cover them all, however the battle between Ian Fletcher in his Peugeot 306 and Chris Fernance in the Kia Picanto was one of the hardest fought. It went over both days!

Sunday dawned an hour earlier, so we had a bit less sleep, but at least the weather was more to our liking. Track A4 was the course for day 2. As usual a few were trapped into arriving at Turn 2 the second time faster than they should have, but at least no serious damage was done. Frank and James were both able to repeat their Class record breaking efforts, so well done to you both.

I have not yet seen the updated Pointscore for the series but based on the numbers we should be in with a chance over the other two clubs, however they were very well represented and took away many trophies, so I guess we'll just have to wait and see!


