PAT GOULDING



Pat Goulding
12 April 1936 - 3rd March 2022

Out Coulding

On the 3rd of March, Pat Goulding passed away at his nursing home in Belmont, NSW. He was 85 years of age.

Pat, born in Gulgong NSW on 12/4/1936, first became involved in motorsport at Craboon, in the early 1960's. He drove the family FB Holden Ute and Simca Aronda in gymkhanas on the neighbouring Ian and Paddy Fergusson's property. He then purchased a home built grey engine Holden special, and for a few years, raced that in various gymkhanas and dirt Hillclimb in the local area.

In 1967 he bought his first, but not last Nota clubman sports car. This car, which he ran almost continuously from 1967 till 2018, was Nota Owner and creator Guy Buckinghams personal race car, and thus a factory entered race car from its build in mid 1962. When Pat purchased the car, it was mainly used in Hillclimb, and that is where Pat had the most success. From 1968 till 1998 Pat won 8 class – Group A sports cars under 1600cc and then VHT class – State Hillclimb championships plus numerous top three finishes in Australian Hillclimb Championships. Pat had class records at Silverdale, Bathurst, Grafton, Parkes, Dapto and Ringwood Hillclimb.

In 1970 Pat and Maureen, his late wife, moved to Belmont where they set up life for the family. Race car in tow, he soon joined the MG Car Club, a club that was very dear to his heart over the next 50 years. Pat competed in many Mattara Hillclimbs over the years, a record 36 events for a car/driver combination. KEP/Mattara was his favourite Hillclimb, with Silverdale a close second. One of Pat's most cherished moment is being given the honour to be the last car to ever race and grace the KEP track, a moment that he was immensely proud of.

In the early 1990's Pat and his trusty red Nota ventured to the tracks of NSW. Amaroo was a particular favourite, as was the short track at Oran Park. He competed at Winton and Eastern Creek in his later years.

With his lovely late wife Maureen – or the Duck as she was known – always by his side, the pair of them, often with kids in tow, travelled and raced all over the State. Dad driving, mum making the tea and coffees, biscuits and cakes, for the drivers and crews that camped or pitted near us. They were a complete team, and both loved everything about the motorsport fraternity.

Sadly, when Maureen took ill, the motor racing slowed down as Pat stayed at home to care for her. And when she passed in 2012, Pat's desire and will to race slowly ebbed away. His last event was the 25th anniversary event at Wakefield Park, back in November 2019.

I completed a cosmetic rebuild of the Nota just before that WP anniversary event, and the look on his face when he saw just how nice the Nota looked and went after a few years of being untouched in the shed, was very much worth it.

Over the years, Pat has also owned a total of 4 Notas, an MGTC, MGA, MGB, a couple of Austin A90 Atlantic convertibles and an A90 Saloon, a 1929 Morris Cowley plus a Mk 3 Sprite.

A car enthusiast he certainly was. On top of these cars, his friendships with this clubs stalwarts –

The Rae's, Baldwin's, Bayliss, Newey's, Lear and Davies families amongst a host of others have been life long and much treasured.

So in finishing, yes, Pat loved his motorsport. He loved his time with the club and their members. From driving, spectating, scrutineering or being an official; -

IT was a 50 odd year association that meant the world to him!!

I took the opportunity to show the 1931 Australian Grand prix winning Day Bugatti/Ford Special. The Day Special represents a significant period in Australian motorsport history from the late 1920s to the early 1950s.

As the current custodian of this car, I have a responsibility to let the car be seen at public events, whether racing or static displays.

What an enormous pity that our club members, by their non-attendance, let down not only the MG Car Club but motorsport in general!

A golden opportunity to represent club motorsport to a different demographic was selfishly squandered by the appearance of only FIVE cars from the club.

Do people realise the increasing challenges that sporting motoring will be facing in the near future?

Public opposition to fossil fuelled cars will ramp up with the now obvious changes in the climate.

Autonomous vehicles will be seen as a safer way of moving our children around thus weaning off the next generation of sporting drivers. With reducing numbers and the increasing age of motor sport competitors, the sport will become even more expensive.

All of this plus a huge loss of credibility for the club for any future invites to public events here in the lower hunter.

Rob was one of well over 50 members who were invited to present their car at the show, which he did. Perhaps if time had permitted more direct invites could have gone out.

I received the initial contact from the Show Committee and asked Rick Vincent if he could look after it which he did. Because of the relatively short notice, it was only possible to send emails as phone conversations all take time.

TRI-CHALLENGE HILLCLIMB - 27 MARCH

Kempsey Sporting Car Club hosted Round 1 at their Mount Cooperabung Hillclimb, and as so often happens for KSCC the weather was not ideal. They had 29 entries but lost a couple by start time, so 27 brave souls took on the Mt Cooperabung hillclimb, which is usually one that is quite slippery and more so when wet.

Saturday saw 10 people have a practice run, including MGCCN members Kenneth Atkins, Troy and Connor Morley, Colin Brooks and Mitch Craig. Some having quite a few runs while others used the day just to get a feel for the hill in the wet. Kenneth used the WRX's AWD to good effect and posted the quickest time for the day of 31.232 on his 4th and final run, 1.406 ahead of the next best time set by Mitch Craig who took advantage of the opportunity to get in 7 runs, improving with each one.

The weather for Sunday wasn't looking too good either so it was apparent that the AWD system would be an advantage. That proved to be the case.

Nine MGCCN members entered and attended, 5 in SV over 3000cc (all Subarus), 2 in type 2 under 2L, (Mitch Craig in his Honda and Graham Orr in his Honda), Rick Yates Type 3 Over 2L in his Mini and Colin Brooks in Type 5 under 2L in his US Legend Chevy.

Peter Akers was probably always going to be the man to beat under the conditions with his well developed WRX and his ability and experience in the car and at Kempsey all improving the odds in his favour, despite not being able to make it to practice the day before. That was a strong motivator for Kenneth, who does tend to manage the slippery conditions reasonably well and doesn't mind seeing the wet stuff on the ground. After all had taken their first run Kenneth was in the lead with a 31.763, with Peter 2nd on 32.748 and 3rd Connor Morley 33.904.

Run 2 was to prove to be the driest of the day, but not dry enough to be a true dry run. Peter took the honours with 31.232 which proved to be FTD and set the pace for others to chase. Kenneth had his worst run, messing up the start to a degree then taking 5th gear instead of 3rd not the best approach to a good run, leaving him in 2nd outright ahead of Darren Read in the Hayward on 32.811 which was his best for the day and locked him into 3rd Outright.

The rest of the day went to Kenneth. Peter couldn't match his times in the wet.

Kenneth set his best on the last run with the wipers on, to record a 31.467 which didn't change the placings as his first run was still good for 2nd outright anyway.

Connor Morley showed how he has advanced his skills to take out 4th outright and 3rd in Class with 33.029 set on run 4. Troy Morley 4th (33.920) & Terry Lanesbury 5th (33.966)

Mitch Craig and Graham Orr were the only two in T2 Under both in Hondas. Mitch setting 33.576 on run 3 to win the class and 5th outright. Rick Yate proved too good for the other entry in T3 over and Colin Brooks took out 2nd in T5 under.

By all reports our crew all had a reasonably enjoyable day and came home with trophies and also set us up with a good points tally for the initial round of the series.
