I have secured a special guest for our May 12th 2023 Club Night.


Mr Phil Murray will be our special guest speaker for the evening.


Phil is the son of 'GELEGNITE' Jack Murray, he is also his fathers biographer, writing 2 books about his fathers' life & exploits over his life time.


Jack Murray was one of motorsports characters winning Redex trials, also entering & winning many local & international motoring events, as well as competing in various forms of other sports.

SPEED EVENT REPORT

2023 Tri Series Round 1 Mt Cooperabung 19th March

The first round of the 2023 Tri Series Hillclimb Series was held on the Sunday 19th March with Practice on the Saturday afternoon. The course at Mt Cooperabung was in the best condition we have experienced for many years. The track was dry, clean and with warm to hot weather kept it that way with no rain or wind to spoil the track.

Temperatures were about 35 C during the warmer periods of the days. Practice went well for all on the Saturday afternoon. A field of 40 entered the event and 39 competed in the timed runs on Sunday.

11 MG car club members competed to represent our club. Most of our group and some of the Tamworth team stayed at the Powerhouse Motel on the Saturday night. We went to the West Kempsey Hotel for a hearty dinner with some banter on the expected performances the next day.

The competition commenced on time and everyone was offered five runs up the hill. Sunday's activities concluded with the presentation of trophies from the 2022 series. Catering was conducted by the local Lions Club

The event ran smoothly all day, no car damage happened, a few failed to complete the course due to car issues.

Darren Read was Fastest, Luca Cox second and Peter Akers third outright, fastest sedan and with a new class record. Les Maloney kept Peter in site all day to come second in class. Simon Nicholson drove the Yamaha Legend car hard to come third in class and fifth outright. Connor Morley finished second in class, ninth outright behind Michael Boaden in his Mitsubishi Evo. Mitch Craig drove well to record first in class and twelfth outright. Terry Lanesbury was fifth in class and sixteenth outright. Christopher Maclucas in his Mx5 was first in class and nineteenth outright.

Kevin Akers recorded first in and twenty second outright. Rick Yates pushed the mini hard to first in class, twenty fourth outright. Roman Vowles in the six cylinder Forrester was first in the class Type 1 4WD thirty first outright, his brother Chad in the same car second in class thirty third outright. Nathan Apps punted the Suzuki Swift up the hill for a best time of 34.779 to be first in class, thirty seventh outright.

These results have put our club in a good position to retain the outright club award for the series this year if we can maintain the numbers participating. Next event in the series is at Tamworth on the 21st May with practice on the Saturday afternoon 20th. The third round this year is also at Tamworth on the 20th August & the final round at Ringwood on the October long weekend.

PLEASE HELP OUR HILLCLIMB OFFICIALS

The work involved in doing the Event Secretary duties for our Hillclimb events is not insignificant, particularly for our newer volunteer officials who are younger and still working full time.

The function of entering via the Motorsport Australia Member Portal, does take a little time for you to get set up, once you have done that, it is a very quick and easy operation.

HOWEVER, if you don't get everything as it should be, it simply adds to the amount of time required for our officials to prepare for the event. There are a few things that you need to check.

 Once you have your chosen car in the system, make sure that you have selected just ONE Hillclimb class. That Class must be one of those listed in the Club's "MGCCN Vehicle Rules 2023 V2" available on the website. The correct class to be selected will come from the drop-down list on Event Entry for "Hillclimb" Classes. All of our classes have the prefix' MGCCN".

Unfortunately over time some of those have become redundant and for reasons unknown to me can't be deleted. Hence the need to refer to the Current version of our vehicle rules. You should only nominate the current 2023 Class against your car. If you compete in events from other series, the best thing is to add the car again and add some letters to the description.

Several people have now got their cars set up for Ringwood Hillclimb by adding the letters "RW" after the model. (eg. Mazda MX5 RW). That way they can select the correctly set up details for our events and not get mixed up with State Classes or Supersprint Classes. By doing this it will assist in getting you allocated correctly into the Class that you intend to run in. The entry list of cars and drivers can be downloaded from event entry and then can be sorted into class order etc. This spreadsheet then assists in setting up the "Running Order" and "Sign On" sheets.

- Currently you also have to complete and submit to the Event Secretary
 your Self Scrutiny and Vehicle Compliance forms. Make sure you have
 actually read the Supplementary Regulations properly and sent the documents to the nominated email address.
- 3. Make sure you have read and completed all details on each of the forms. Many people neglect to tick the boxes indicating that the car complies with

Schedule A & B of the current Australian Motorsport Manual. That may be because they don't know what Schedule A & B actually says! (These are printed in this edition of Clubtorque to make it easy for you.)

- 4. Making the entry fee payment. There are two options, however by selecting to pay using the Event Entry Credit Card method, you do three negative things.
 - a. Firstly, it costs you more.
 - b. There is a delay in the information coming through to our Bank Account from the MA Event Entry System, so we don't know if your payment has gone through successfully. Technically your entry is not valid until payment has been received.
 - c. If you pay by this system, the Treasurer has more work to record who has paid and to enter your payment into the Accounting Software.
- 5. If you pay by Direct Deposit straight into the Club's Nominated Bank account, it automatically assigns it to you and uploads daily to the Xero Accounting package. From that it is a very quick process to print a list of payment received and forward it to the Event Secretary so that they can then "Accept" your entry. Assuming of course you have also sent the Self Scrutiny and Vehicle Compliance forms in too. (As Treasurer, I already have more than enough time devoted to car club work and your help with this simple issue will be appreciated!)

Should you be having difficulties getting set up, there are many people who know what to do and I'm sure would be happy to assist.

The Motorsport Event Entry system is there to make it easier for all, and it can if everyone gets their inputs correctly done.

ADVISE TO COMPETITORS ABOUT —

There has been a small change to some of the MGCCN Vehicle Rules 2023.

36 Engine Block from other than Vehicle Manufacturer, for Special Vehicles this is allowed YES!!

In the Motorsport Australia Event Entry, a number of classes have been renamed and some others have been added.

If you have a vehicle in a class in the Original Class list below, can you update your details in Motorsport Australia Event Entry system to the corresponding Class Name in the New Class Name list.

For the "MGCCN - Type 5 Prod Block" classes, this means the engine is based on a car or truck engine block. Engine blocks from Motorcycles are considered to be in the "Special Block" classes





REGISTER SECRETARY

We have had 1 new vehicle added to our Historic Vehicle Register since the last magazine report.

In reality, it is not an additional vehicle but a transfer of ownership. For those of you who attended the V8 Supercars event in Newcastle, and visited our car club display within the circuit confines, you probably would have admired a very nice 1988 Austin Mini Cooper in the display. This vehicle has been purchased by a new club member and historic registration has been reinstated through the club. Looking forward to seeing this car appear at some of our future events.

February there were 10 registration renewals, with a further 13 in March.

Membership fees were due on 1st March. If you have a vehicle on historic registration and have not renewed your membership, **do not** take the vehicle out on a public road as technically it is not registered. It is a condition of Historic Registration that you maintain full financial membership of your sponsoring club.
