We have had 4 new vehicles added to our Historic Vehicle Register since the last magazine report.




Phil is the son of 'GELEGNITE' Jack Murray, he is also his fathers biographer, writing 2 books about his fathers' life & exploits over his life time.


Jack Murray was one of motorsports characters winning Redex trials, also entering & winning many local & international motoring events, as well as competing in various forms of other sports.

We had a small contingent make the journey to Adelaide this year. Some took the direct route, some the long way home and Darren and I undertook a BC (before children) type adventure both there and back. It incorporated the celebrations of a significant birthday on my part, and we wanted to explore the performance of our recently acquired MG RV8. The RV8 was based on the body shell of an MGB but having owned and driven an MGB on a similar trip (in 1986 definitely BC), the RV8 offers more cabin comfort but significantly less boot space. Just as well we are seasoned travellers well versed in the art of flexible luggage and finding the tiniest nook in which to fit one more shoe. Thanks to John and Rose Collins for taking our helmet because I really didn't fancy nursing it for the 5000km round trip.

We explored many backroads along the NSW south coast and rural Victoria on our way to Melbourne for the F1 Grand Prix. We hadn't been to the Australian Grand Prix - we have been to Silverstone and Monte Carlo. Any thoughts that the Australian event would be less special were quickly dispelled. We undertook a tour of the track and had photo ops with the Champions and Constructors trophy. The weather was variable - hot in the grandstand, cool breeze outside and the occasional shower. Rain ponchos were always at the ready. Such an exciting weekend, a variety of support races, great supercars racing and crazy F1 racing.

Then we ventured along the Great Ocean Road, two days in McLaren Vale exploring the fruits of that region and onto Glenelg for the National Meeting. Our team consisted of Bruce and Beth Fraser (MG TF 2005); John and Rose Collins (MGF), Dale Powell and Donna (MGF), Michael, Raechel and Chloe Fraser (MGZT), Darren and Fran Hodgson (RV8). 5 cars and 6 competitors in total and we punched above our weight all weekend.

John won the Rocker Cover Racing on Friday night. At the Concours on Saturday all our cars were judged: John came 1st in class, I came 3rd in class.; Michael and Bruce 4th in their classes and Dale 6th. There was an impressive number of pre-war cars in attendance and an MG Arnott bodied special, based on an MG TD chassis. That night was Disney themed and we dressed as Dalmatians, as did most of Victorian members so indeed there were probably 101 of us, LOL!!

Sunday: bright and early we drove an hour out of town to Tailem Bends and the Motorsport complex. Both Motorkhana (Sunday) and Super sprint (Monday) were there so we stayed overnight. For the Motorkhana it was cold and windy and the tests were complicated, many fell victim to those dreaded WDs.

GLENELG AND THE ROAD LESS TRAVELLED

Monday was brighter and the track long and fast. The hard road tyres of the RV8 squealed and protested and spun the car around a few times but held on for reasonable times. Since all the other RV8s went on the social runs, we came 1st and 2nd by default but gave the car a thorough workout.

For the Overall Results we came 4th in the Nuffield Trophy behind Qld, Victoria and SA and 5th in the Wratten Trophy – remember that's with only 6 drivers. Individual event's results for the Motorkhana: John 4th; Dale 7th; Bruce 1st, Michael 1st, Darren 1st, Fran 2nd. Bruce, Michael and Darren making the Top 10. For the Speed Event: John 2nd; Dale 6th, Michael 1st, Bruce 1st; Darren 1st, Fran 2nd. Michael and Darren making the Top 10.

The Trip home was more interesting for Bruce and Beth as the F sheared a suspension bolt and it had to be trailered home. We broke the zipper on the soft top so it's now held together with zip ties. John and Rose had many challenges there and back with their tow car. Dale and Donna were heading back along the Great Ocean Road, I assume they arrived back in 1 piece.

Well done to the MGCC SA and our good friend Tim Edmonds as Chairperson of their organising committee. It was a fun weekend. WE NEED A MULTIDISCIPLINARY GRASSROOTS

Infrastructure Upgrade Funding Grant for Ringwood Park Motorsport Complex.

A bit of History on this Subject: -

Pre Covid it was decided by the Board of the MGCC Newcastle that the sealing of the entrance road was long overdue and along with that venture, a tar sealed Motorkhana pad was also desirable, and perhaps a cost saving, while having equipment on site would make the overall package financially viable.

Various quotes and advice were sought from Civil Contractors and Planning/Surveyors to firm up an overall concept and cost structure.

The above was a thorough and extensive process, and it became clear that a Tar Motorkhana pad was not within our budget, at the time, and as there was no Local or State Government Funding Grants available, to the extent of our requirements, it was decided to only proceed with the sealing of the entrance road.

What's changed?

The State Government, and Motorsport Australia (MA), recently conducted an online Club Business Grant Application Workshop, which was duly attended by interested Club representatives.

Motorsport Australia have, since August 2021, been instrumental in assisting several Car Clubs in Queensland and in particular Victoria State Government Grants to the order of \$500,000 for Geelong Motorsports Complex (Tar Motorkhana Pad), MG Car Club of Victoria (Upgrades to Rob Roy Hill Climb Track and amenities), these achievements are detailed on the MA Website.

MOTORSPORT VENUE, CAN YOU ASSIST??

What is the status of the process?

Current quotes are being compiled for various options, like extending and tar sealing of the Quarry area, using the spoils to build a larger Pad in part of the lower Dirt Motorkhana/Cross area.

Before applying for a Government Grant an approved Development Application must be obtained, and the project shovel ready.

This process incurs obvious costs and must be kept to a minimum due to the risks involved, we are therefore reaching out to our Membership for any skilled/qualified person who has the drive to assist in preparing a Development Application.

Clearly the Tar Motorkhana Pad/s will have many other viable uses, like our Young Driver Training Programme and various Driver Training organizations have expressed a desire to hire such a facility.
