Our last club night was well attended with the Guest Speaker from the Koala Sanctuary in Port Stephens. They provided us with a lot of relevant and interesting information on the Koala Sanctuary and Hospital caring for our precious koalas.

Port Stephens Koala Hospital Talk

On the Club Night of 14th July, Sharon Egan from Port Stephens Koala Hospital gave a talk about the work they do.

The hospital is located within the grounds of the Port Stephens Koala Sanctuary; however it operates as a separate entity.

Funding for the Koala Hospital is entirely from donations and the sale of a small variety of items in the Koala Sanctuary Gift Shop.

Koalas in general only eat about 8 varieties of eucalyptus trees, however an individual koala might only 3 varieties due to its location and what its mother eats.

There are a lot of regulations regarding koalas:

- Stipulating that 1000 trees need to be managed for each koala in care. The Hospital and Sanctuary have several dedicated plantations as well as collecting from 60 sites within the Port Stephens LGA.
- The amount of time that koalas can be kept in care (3 days).
- Koalas need to be released within 300m of where they were captured.
- Who can handle a koala.

The Koala Hospital does also look after other wildlife, there have been a wombat, an echidna, and a possum.

The next Club Night will be on Friday 11th August 2023 with a Guest Speaker from the Salvation Army who will be advising us of the **Drive for Life Program** which they provide for disadvantaged youth to gain their driver's license.

Sponsors of all levels will be mentioned at multiple times over the course of the event by the commentators, and broadcast over the PA system for all at the event to hear.



Breakfast at Beach Bum Cafe





The sixth round of the NSW Hillclimb Championship was held at Oakburn Park on the weekend of 15th, 16th July 2023. Weather was fine both days with temperatures in the mid teens each day. Importantly there was no wind or rain around for the duration of the event.

Next door at the speedway a Monster Truck Show was held on the later part of Saturday afternoon and night.

Importantly the track configuration was changed to include almost two laps of the track from a standing start on the road normally used for track safety vehicles through the last corner onto the straight whilst accelerating then one complete loop of the circuit followed by almost another lap to finish at the normal finish point after the "Esses". This was the first time this configuration was used so a bonus was that class and outright winners also are the initial record holders.

Racing cars were represented by the Cox family now with a second car. Outright went to Peter Brown in the Prosport Mullsanne with a best time of 1.07.3320, Second was Matthew Brown in his Audi RS4 Avant with a best time of 1.09.1310, this being Matthew's first visit to this track. Third was Paul Finch in his immaculate PRB Clubman with a best time of 1.09.4220. Paul acknowledges the performance was orchestrated by two important points, new Avon tyres delivered and fitted that week and the manufacturer of his car being his pit crew for the weekend.

Fourth went to Wayne Penrose in the Superbug with a best time of 1.09.5780 followed by Luca Cox in the Hyper Hugger for a best time of 1.09.9240. Next was another on his first visit to Tamworth, Michael Larmorem in a late model 2.0 Toyota MR2 for a best of 1.10.4540. Greg Jones give his Locost Clubman all finish to finish seventh with a best of 1.10.6400. Tim Blake finished eighth in the Subaru with a best of 1.10.9930, having a moment with locked front brakes completing the useful life of a pair of front tyres.

Craig Klingbiel was next in the Honda Civic with a best of 1.11.0020 closely followed by Peter Akers in the Subaru with a best time of 1.11.0530 to finish tenth. Peter raised dust in two corners on one run running wide trying to close the gap on the cars immediately in front of him. Tim was only six hundreds of a second and two places in front so worth the effort to have a go.

Our club was represented by five members - Tim, Peter, Grant Liddell, Andrew Walker and James Graham. Grant finished 23rd outright with a best time of 1.18.5310 secs in his Datsun 1200, Andrew in the Turnham Bandit enjoyed the paddock arrangements being pitted next to Paul Finch and recorded a best of 1.20.6330 for 28th outright. James Graham pushed the Excell hard to record a best of 1.22.8970 for 35th outright.

OAKBURN PARK TAMWORTH 16TH JULY 2023

A few offs but no accident damage was observed due to the track having wide runoff in the faster areas. Mechanical damage known was a broken gearbox in a Subaru and some power issues with the Penrose Superbug. The new track configuration was well received by the competitors. The time between the finish of one car and the release of the next was quick and a credit to the organisation by the Tamworth Sporting Car Club.

The next and final round of the State series is at Ringwood on Saturday 12th for Practice and Sunday 13th for Competition. There are already some potential Australian Championship entrants entered for this event in preparation for the Australian at our circuit the last weekend of October.



M.G. Centenary in Australia 1923 - 2023



HOW THE MGF NEARLY BECAME A MINI!

In 1997, BMW's then design chief used the 30th anniversary of Mini's celebrated Monte Carlo rally win to create a concept car showing his vision for Mini's future and it was altogether sportier. Firm over function. This is the "Anniversary Concept Vehicle", or "ACV 30" for short. (Sounds like a hard-drive model, not a rally car!)

This coupe-like model sat on an **MGF** chassis, making it an unusual mid-engined Mini.

Dominated by bulbous wheel arches and a football stadium's worth of spotlights, the ACV 30 did indeed give clues about what BMW's eventual comeback Cooper would look like. Blacked-out roof pillars, a central exhaust outlet and colour-contrast roof and stripe combos were all soon to become staples of the new millennium's Mini.

However apparently the mid-engined, rear wheel drive Mini didn't go beyond this concept.





THE LAND SPEED RECORD BREAKING MG EX181


In 1957 the MG Car Company arrived at the Bonneville Salt Flats with an unusually shaped vehicle and legendary racing driver Stirling Moss. The car was called the MG EX 181 and it was entered into the Class F land-speed series for cars with engines between 1.1 and 1.5 litres.

The EX 181's unique body was hiding a 1.5 litre twin-cam, supercharged MGA engine that had been tuned to run on 86% methanol laced with nitrobenzene, acetone, and sulphuric ether. The engine produced a whopping 290hp at 7,000 rpm and on the 23rd of August 1957 Stirling Moss took it up to a top speed of 245.64mph (395.31 km/h), taking the land-speed record easily over the previous record holder who held it at 203mph.

AUGUST 2023

MG wasn't quite finished with the EX 181 and took the car back to Bonneville in 1959 with racing driver Phil Hill, the engine had been tuned slightly higher and now produced 300hp. Phil Hill took the car to a top speed of 254.91 mph (410.23 km/h), easily breaking MG's own record from 2 years previously.

The base BMC Engine was fitted with a twin-ohc head and a Shorrocks eccentric vane supercharger to give 290 bhp at 7,300 rpm. Later tuned to produce 300 bhp. (Paul Whitworth, there's a challenge!!)
